

Dr. Doris Fienga's lecture on Leonardo da Vinci presented by the Friends of the UCSD Library

The work of Leonardo da Vinci will be the subject of a talk by art historian Dr. Doris Fienga at 3 p.m. Thursday, January 29, at the University of California, San Diego.

The Friends of the UCSD Library lecture will be held in Conference Room 111A in the university's Administrative Complex. The lecture is free and open to the public.

Facsimiles of some of the artist's drawings will be on display in the Central University Library before and after the lecture. The work will be exhibited on the main floor and in the Mandeville Department of Special Collections on the eighth floor.

Dr. Fienga received a master of arts degree in art history from UC Santa Barbara and a doctorate from UCLA. She has studied extensively in Europe and specializes in Leonardo da Vinci's life and work.

In conjunction with the lecture, a bus trip to the J. Paul Getty Museum in Malibu has been scheduled Thursday, February 5. The Leonardo da Vinci Nature Studies from the Queen's Collection at Windsor Castle are currently on exhibit at the museum.

The bus will leave from a parking lot on the corner of La Jolla Village Drive and Villa La Jolla at 8 a.m. and return at 6 p.m. Cost of the trip is \$15 and reservations can be made through Alvina Robertson at the UC San Diego Central University Library, C-075-G, La Jolla, CA 92093.
