

Second Annual "Artzapoppin" Festival of rhythm and art set

April 10, 1972

A constant kaleidoscope of rhythm and art will be featured at the second annual "Artzapoppin" Festival on Sunday, April~23.

The festival, to be held from noon to 4 p.m. in the courtyard of the Salk Institute for Biological Studies in La Jolla, will feature continuous music and entertainment amid exhibits by over thirty prominent local artists. Refreshments will also be available.

Tickets are \$2.00 for adults and \$1.00 for students and children. Admission proceeds plus 25 per cent of the art sales will go to benefit the La Jolla Civic-University Orchestra and Chorus.

Musical groups performing include the La Jolla Civic-University Orchestra, conducted by Thomas Nee, associate professor of music at UCSD; the UCSD Chorus, under the direction of UCSD graduate student Ron Jeffers, and the Ballet Arts of San Diego, under the direction of Dorothy Lee. The Cameron Highland Pipe Band and San Diego Highland Dancers and the San Diego Philippino Dance Group will lend an international note to the entertainment while Buford Scuggins String Quartet will play bluegrass country ballads and Kirk Bouterse will play traditional American music on his banjo. A more modern touch to the music will be expressed by the rock group, Don McLeod's Mine and Music Machine and by a UCSD jazz group, The Moldy Figs.

Special features at the festival include a demonstration of the Ukranian art of painting eggs by Luba Kytasta, handmade dolls by Bets Bernard, a mineral and fossil display by Bob Pogats, kites by Mary Nee, graphology or the art of handwriting analysis by Marsha Greenberg and Lucille Cheng. Arrangements of flowers from South Africa will be provided by Mr. and Mrs. Howard Asper of the Escondido Green Valley Nurseries.

Serigraphs by Rancho Santa Fe artist Mary Ellen Long, rubbings by award-winning La Mesa artist Dixon Fish, plexiglass paintings and abstract designs by Lilli Hill, chairman of the "Artzapoppin" Festival, and photographs by Barbara Feldman will also be displayed.

Ceramics, oils and acrylics, enamel art, weaving, pottery, sculpture, fiber constructions, whistles and wood- and wind-chime craft will also be exhibited. A special children's exhibit from Gillespie Cottage, La Jolla, has also been arranged.
