

Dr. Kenneth Bowles appointed Director of Computer Center

Dr. Kenneth L. Bowles has been appointed Director of the Computer Center at the University of California, San Diego, Chancellor John S. Galbraith announced today.

Dr. Bowles, Professor of Applied Electrophysics at UCSD, replaces Dr. Anthony Hassitt, who has been Acting Director since February, 1966. Dr. Hassitt will return to his former research position in the Department of Physics.

Dr. Bowles, who is a graduate of Cornell University, helped to found the Applied Electrophysics Department at UCSD. Before coming to the University, he was physicist for the Central Radio Propagation Laboratory of the National Bureau of Standards at Boulder, Colorado.

He is known for his work in radio wave propagation and built the Jimarca Radio Observatory, one of the largest radars in the world.
