

Media Advisory, noted Catholic theologian Hans Küng at UCSD on March 15

MEDIA ADVISORY

EVENT: Hans Küng, one of the most noted Catholic theologians living today, will be available for media interviews prior to a public lecture expected to attract more than 800 attendees.

DATE/TIME: Friday, March 15, 1991 -- 4:45 p.m.

LOCATION: Gallery A, Price Center, University of California, San Diego. (Gallery A is located on the second level, near the student post office.)

BACKGROUND: The controversial theologian, who teaches at the University of Tubingen, Germany, will give his public lecture at 8 p.m. on the subject, "No Peace Among Nations Without Peace Among the Religions." As a maverick among Catholics, Küng believes the world is not centered in one location or in a single true religion. He argues that if the ecumenism of the Second Vatican Council is extended to include not only the Christian religions but all religions, the world's churches could act in concert as positive forces for achieving peace.

Küng's visit is sponsored by the Eugene M. Burke C.S.P. Lectureship on Religion and Society.
