

Dr. George E. Masek, appointment to Assoc. Prof. of Physics

Dr. George E. Masek, 37, an experimental high energy nuclear physicist, has accepted appointment as Associate Professor of Physics at the University of California, San Diego, it has been announced by University President Clark Kerr and San Diego Chancellor Herbert York.

The appointment is effective as of July 1, 1964, however, Dr. Masek is on leave of absence until January 1, 1965, when he will begin work on the UCSD campus.

Dr. Masek served as an Assistant Professor of Physics at the University of Washington from 1957 to 1961 and as an Associate Professor until joining the UCSD staff. He served as an Instructor at Princeton University in 1956 and 1957. In the summer of 1961, Dr. Masek was a consultant for the High Energy Machine program at the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory and a year later he worked with the Stanford Linear Accelerator.

He attended Coronado High School, San Diego State College, and Stanford University receiving a B.S. degree in physics from Stanford in 1950. He also received advanced degrees from Stanford completing work on his Ph.D. in physics in 1956. While at Stanford he served as a research assistant in the University's Hansen Laboratory.

Dr. Masek holds memberships in the American Physical Society and the American Civil Liberties Union. Since 1955 he has published a number of articles dealing with high energy physics in journals and reviews.
