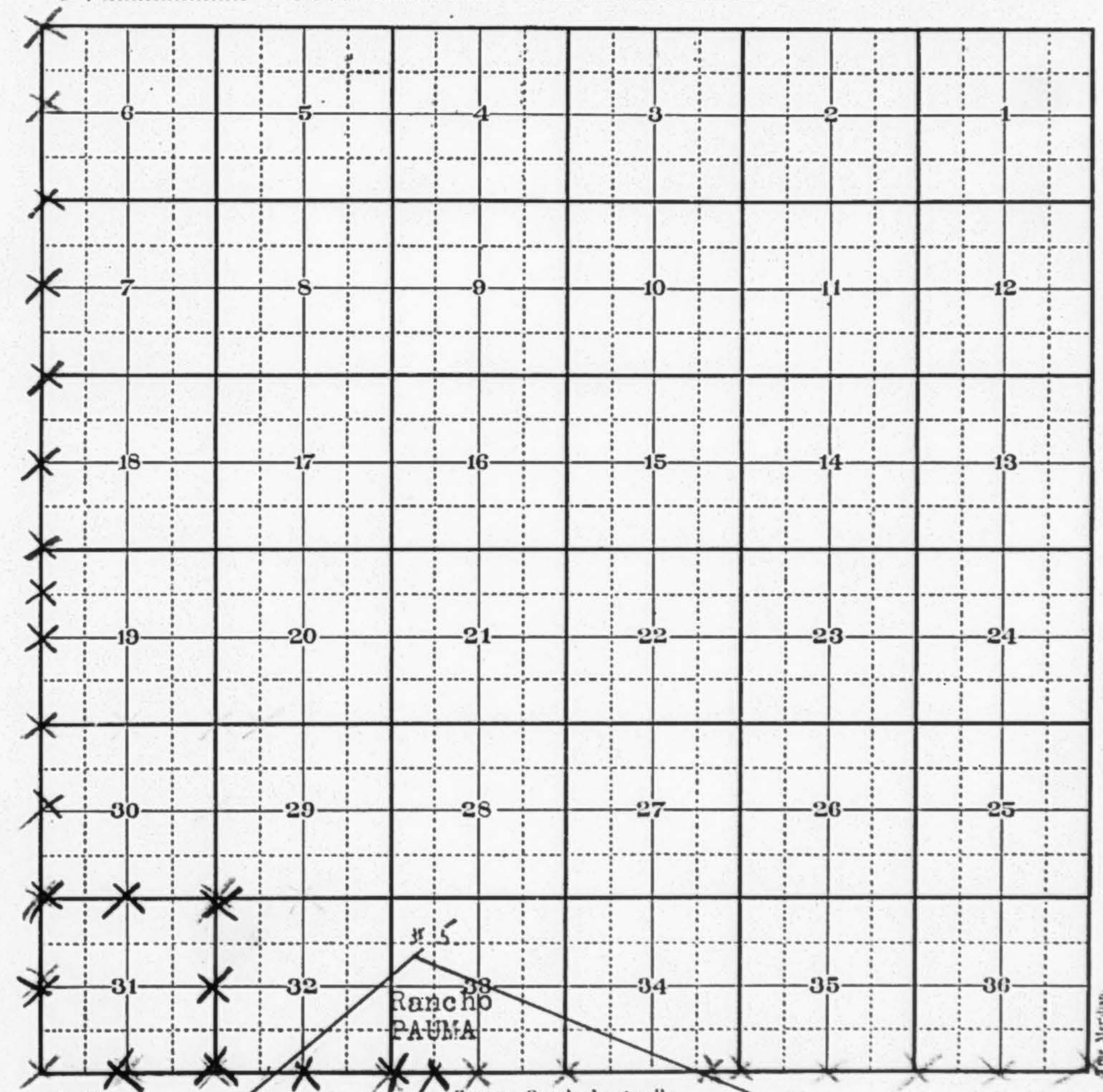

24.07 Set granite rock 28 x 16 x 14 ins. marked with 6 notches on N. E. S. & W. edges for cor. to Twps. 9 and 10 S. R. 1 W. and 9 and 10 S R. 1 E. and raised a mound of stone around it.

This cor. is on the W. side of steep canon.

Land very broken, soil worthless.

March 26,

From cor. to Tps. 9 and 10 S. on Meridian, I ran

West on random, setting temp. cor. at every 40 and 80 chs.

179.10 Int. Pauma ranch line. March 27th.

298.20 Base of mountain, I find no trace of any mound or anything else, to designate a cor., so I continue WEST on random.

322.60 Int. W.B. sec. 4, 264 lks. S. of cor. to secs. 32 and 33, T 9 S R 1W. This cor. is an Elder post 3 ins. in dia. in stone and earth mound. No marks. This falling being 65 lks. per mile.

23.00 Foot of steep mountain, no sign of any cor.

40.00 Left small mound of stone on line.

March 30th.

143.50 Int. Pauma Rancho line here. I set a granite rock 20 x 14 x 10 in. marked R.P. on W. face for intersection cor. and raised a mound of stone around it. This cor. is on SW. slope of mountain and 199.20 chs. N. 63½° W. of intersection of Ranch line with Meridian line.

162.60 Set granite rock 26 x 12 x 4 ins. marked with 2 notches on E. and 4 notches on W. edges for cor. to secs. 3 and 2 on N.B. of Tp. and raised a mound of stone around it. This cor. is on S. slope of main range of mountains.

Land broken, soil worthless.

From cor. to secs. 3 and 2 on N.B. of Tp. I ran S. 89° 32' E. along N.B. sec. 2, ascending.

Ascending steep brushy rocky mountain with scattering oaks and yellow pines.
61.00 Yellow pine 12 ins. in dia. 15 lks. S. of line.
78.00 Ridge sloping S., very broken and rocky + 400. Descending.

63.40 Ravine 60 lks. wide course NW.
80.26 Int. N.B. of Tp. Here I find a stone mound. No marks, 29 lks. " of my line, I destroy this and set a granite rock 14 x 20 x 26 ins. for closing cor. to Tps. 9 S. Rs. 1 and 2 W. marked C.C. on N. face and 6 notches on S. & W. edges. This cor. os on NW. face of rocky mountain and is 19.48 chs. W. of stone mound on E.B. of sec. 31, T. 8 S. R. 1 W.

The land along this mile is very broken, burnt brush.

Soil, rocky and absolutely worthless.

April 21st.

From 1/4 sec. cor. bet. secs. 31 and 36, which is an oak post 3 ins. dia. in M.M.Sicklers ditch on N. face of brushy mountains. This post, Mr. Sickler tells me that when he was making his ditch in 1881 for his water power, he sent 2 Indians ahead clearing ditch line,

and that when he came up to this point, he found that the Indians had chopped down the oak tree, which was blazed and marked 1/4 on W. face, and that there and then, he took the same tree and drove it down about 12 ins. into the ground at the identical spot where it first stood.
