I have also a letter from Mr Manly with acct of sale of my sugar
which sold for 81/8 & 1/2 = 167:10/5 which I think a pretty good sale he
writes me as the American can come out again before Sept he has chartered
a small vessel to send to Savanalarum carrying about 120 tuns and that I shall

purpose, as also finger, but I believe none of that to be had at same
price as before all Wm Submans if not disengaged I believe you may get 2 ad
but perhaps they will send their little Mallop round for it,

This will be handed you by Mr Bright who wants his Ballance now
and I told him I would not pay it yet I suppose he will be saying something
to you about it but I must conveniently pay it yet as I must pay Mr
Richard Gordon some soon so that I must get them out of a little
congratulation, as I believe you have no great use for your cattle at Tregate
you might spare a few that is in good order to help to help out the
blond for Capt Burchell if they can get out as out it will do with the
term which I promised him all I made before he sailed, that I am now
may be shared otherwise

but Gordon the attorney was so little to be hoped with in Town that I
could not get that affair done, but he has promised to send it down
