

Dr. Norman A. Baily is PILS lecturer

Norman A. Baily, Professor of Radiology at University of California, San Diego, School of Medicine, will deliver the fourth of the Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series, presented by the Committee for Arts and Lectures, January 30, at 4:15 p.m. in the Humanities-Library Auditorium, Revelle Campus. His topic is "Energy Disposition by High Energy Particles and Biological Systems."

Dr. Baily received his Ph.D. in Physics from Columbia University in 1952, where he held the position of Research Scientist, Radiological Research Laboratory. From 1954-19059, he was Chief Physicist at the Roswell Park Memorial Institute in Buffalo, New York, directing the physics and biophysics programs of the Department of Radiation Therapy. Until 1967, he was manager of the Space Sciences Department of the Hughes Research Laboratories, and immediately prior to joining the UCSD faculty in 1968, he was Professor of Radiology and Director of Radiological Sciences, Emory University, Atlanta, Georgia. Admission is free and open to the public.
