

Guarneri String Quartet to perform in Mandeville

The Guarneri String Quartet, applauded for its performances of works by Beethoven, Schumann and Debussy, will perform in the Mandeville Auditorium at the University of California, San Diego on Friday, March 3. The concert is scheduled for 8:30 p.m.

The Guarneri's performance is part of the 1977-78 UC San Diego Faculty Chamber Series.

Since its debut in 1965, the quartet has been regarded as one of the most popular and praised groups of the era. It has performed throughout the United States and in Canada, Europe, New Zealand and Australia.

Members of the group are Arnold Steinhardt and John Dalley, violinists; Michael Tree, violinist, and David Soyer, cellist. Each of the artists is a well known virtuoso in his own right. The four played chamber music together frequently at the Marlboro and Casals Festivals before joining to form the Guarneri.

The quartet takes its name from the great family of Italian stringed instrument makers. Steinhardt has a violin made by Joseph Guarneri in 1740 and Soyer a cello made by Andrea Guarneri in 1669.
