## RULES AND REGULATIONS

The use of a safe is in every instance granted by The Chase Safe Deposit Company and accepted by the renter using the safe upon the express understanding and agreement that The Chase Safe Deposit Company may, by a notice mailed to the renter or deputy, if any, at the last known address on the Company's books, terminate such use and may require the vacation and surrender of the safe and the keys or combination thereto at any time upon the repayment or tender of repayment for the unexpired time of a pro rata portion of the amount paid for the use of the safe.

If a key to a safe deposit box is lost, the Safe Deposit Company should be notified without delay and the remaining key brought into the office of the Company in order that the lock may be changed. Lost keys must be paid for. Where both keys to any box are lost, the box must be broken open and the lock changed in the presence of the box renter, the cost of which must be paid by the box renter.

The Company has the right to consider that a safe is not surrendered until the keys are returned and the Company is notified of the surrender and that the safe is empty. Such notification should be in writing over the signature of the safe holder.

Fiduciaries should file papers evidencing their authorization as such.

Partnerships should give prompt notice of changes in membership.

The Company should be immediately notified of any change of address of the box renter or any deputy.

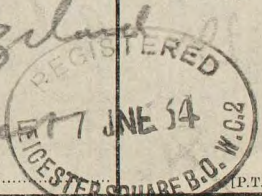

**Extracts from Regulations for  
Registration of Postal Packets.**  
(For full Regulations see Post Office Guide.)

**GENERAL.**

I. No compensation is paid in respect of a Postal Packet in which any prohibited article is enclosed.

II. No compensation is paid for consequential damage.

III. The decision of the Postmaster-General upon any claim for compensation is final.

IV. No legal liability attaches to the Postmaster-General in respect of the issue of this Certificate.

**INLAND.**

V. Subject to the published regulations, the Postmaster-General pays compensation for loss or damage of an Inland Postal Packet on which a Registration Fee has been paid, as follows:—

PER.	Limit of Compensation
3d.     ...     ...	£5
4d.     ...     ...	£20

and 1d. extra for each £20 up to £400, the maximum.

VI. No compensation is paid in respect of any Registered Postal Packet containing MONEY unless such money be enclosed in one of the official registered letter envelopes sold at any Post Office and be sent by Registered Letter Post. The term "money" includes coin, Bank notes, Currency notes, stamps, postal and money orders, cheques, and any other security for money whether negotiable or not. The maximum compensation for loss of COIN is £5.

VII. No compensation is paid for damage to any packet, whether sent by Letter or by Parcel Post, containing eggs, soft fruit, or any exceptionally fragile article, or for damage to any packet sent by Letter Post containing liquid or semi-liquid.

VIII. No compensation is paid for damage to a Postal Packet sent by Registered Letter Post, and containing an article of a fragile nature, unless such packet be marked "*Fragile—with care*" when posted.

IX. The Postmaster-General does not accept any liability as a consequence of the registration of a Postal Packet afterwards found to have been imperfectly packed.

X. The Postmaster-General does not in any case pay more than the actual value of the article lost or the amount of the damage sustained.

**IMPERIAL AND FOREIGN.**

XI. Registration is not a system of insurance. It gives no title to compensation for loss or damage of contents as distinct from loss of the entire packet; and the payment made in *no circumstances exceeds £2*.

Packets sent to many countries abroad can be insured against loss or damage. For Registration and Insurance Regulations see Post Office Guide.

Parcels.*

I. No legal liability attaches to the Postmaster-General in respect of the issue of this Certificate.

II. The Regulations under which it is issued will be found in the Post Office Guide, which may be purchased or consulted at any Post Office.

III. Subject to these Regulations, compensation is given for the loss or damage of parcels addressed to most of the Dominions, Colonies, and Foreign Countries to which the Parcel Post extends. In certain cases no compensation is given unless the parcel is insured. In others compensation not exceeding 32s. is given for uninsured parcels.

IV. The fees for insurance are 5d. for the first £12 of insured value, and 2d. for every additional £12 or part thereof up to £400. In no case can a parcel be insured for more than £400; and in the service with some countries the limit is less. (See P.O. Guide.)

V. The amount paid as compensation will in no case exceed the actual amount of the loss or damage, the maximum limit of insured value, or the amount for which the parcel is insured.

VI. No compensation is given for loss or damage consequential upon the loss, damage or delay of any postal packet, or of any part of its contents.

VII. Any insurance effected contrary to the Regulations will be invalid.

N.B.—An Advice of the Delivery of an insured parcel may be obtained by the sender on application either at the time of posting or subsequently, on payment of 3d.

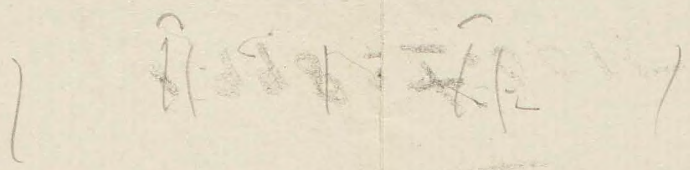
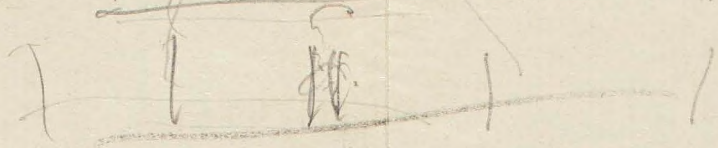
