LOCAL NOTES

Armistice Day was observed in this city with a parade this morning from the foot of Broadway to the stadium and exercises this afternoon at the Spreckels organ pavilion in Balboa park. Federal Judge Benjamin F. Bledsoe made the principal address. Judge T. L. Lewis was chairman of the day and presented the golden scrolls. The Red Cross medals were presented by Mayor Wilde.

Work of resurfacing the Biological grade on the state highway above La Jolla has been completed and payment of 75% of the contract price will be made to the contractor.

Six Mexican laborers at the highway construction camp near Jacumba last Saturday night were held up by three Mexican bandits, who took their watches, jewelry and all the coin they had.

The playgrounds commission on Wednesday will consider a number of offers for a site for a playground on Mission Hills. Five acres of land owned by the city near the Grant school may be used in preference to other locations. The commission will make an estimate of the cost of the improvement so as to include it in the budget to be filed with the city council.

It was expected that the flagship of the Pacific fleet, the New Mexico, now anchored in the bay off the municipal pier, would remain here several weeks, but it is announced that she will leave port on Friday. The presence of the big ship in the harbor is proof conclusive of the claim made for it of its capacity to accommodate the biggest ships in the navy.

About twenty machines full of Riverside boosters have been making things lively in this city for the road bonds since yesterday. Riverside people are anxious for the road from the county line to Camp Kearny to be paved, in order to give them a direct paved highway to this city.

It is reported that the local lodge of Elks is contemplating raising its building at Broadway and Second one story so as to have a number of stores for rent on the ground floor. The investment would prove a paying one, as the location is very desirable.

The launching of the concrete tanker Cuyamaca, announced about to take place a number of times and finally set for December 1st, is reported to have been postponed until New Year's. Her sister ship, the San Pasqual, will be launched on February first.

The outing of the Rotary Club next Saturday at Del Mar has been postponed owing to the celebration incident upon the driving of the golden spike marking the physical completion of the San Diego & Arizona railroad. The outing will be held at a date to be announced later.

The city council has given the auditing firm of Vreeland & Everts the contract of auditing the books of the city, including the books of the park commission, for \$2,000.

The city council has appropriated \$12,000 from the reserve fund to the Barrett dam fund in order to carry on the preliminary work started some

time ago. It is expected that the bonds for the construction of the dam will be voted by the people and the structure finished by the end of next year.

The city council has under consideration an ordinance presented by the health department creating the position of physician and pharmacist to conduct a clinic for persons addicted to drugs.

The Bank of Italy of Los Angeles, has made an offer to take the entire issue of road bonds, \$2,300,000, if they are voted by the people of this county tomorrow.

TELEGRAPHIC BRIEFS

Victor Berger, the Socialist congressman, who is to be unseated for alleged disloyalty during the war, on being granted the privilege of the floor in the house yesterday referred to congress as a "rubber stamp" of the administration, and criticized the president and the administration for their autocratic stand during the war. However, by a vote of 309 to 1 the house voted to bar him from his seat, and a special election will probably soon be held in his district.

An Allied victory pilgrimage took place to Lourdes in France today. It was led by Cardinal Luco, archbishop of Rheims, and four British and nineteen French generals took part in it.

Among the things to be discussed in London by the British government in connection with the visit of President Poincare of France and Foreign Minister Pichon will be the putting into effect of the peace treaty, taking into consideration the action of this country.

The whole of England is agog with the suggestion made by Lloyd George that a peace might be negotiated with the Bolsheviks in Russia. Most newspapers are against the proposition.

The department of justice is determined to show no mercy to the anarchists arrested in the past few days in various cities, as some of the literature seized advocates the overthrow of the government. As the majority of the men arrested are aliens they will be deported.

Trains are reported snowbound in the northern part of Colorado and livestock is suffering greatly from the effects of the blizzard, which unexpectedly struck that section last Sunday. The loss will be heavy.

President Wilson, Secretary of War Baker and General Pershing have issued statements to the people on the occasion of the first anniversary of the end of the war, the message of the president fully covering every angle of the tremendous importance of the signing of the armistice.

Assemblyman Crombie Allen has addressed an open letter to Governor Stephens demanding a thorough investigation of the charge that the University of California is permeated with Bolshevism. Some members of the faculty are alleged to be out-and-out Bolsheviks.

It is reported that Ignace Paderewski, owing to illness, is to be replaced as premier of Poland by Stanislaus Pateck. Paderewski is reported to be in very strained circum-

stances, having sunk his whole fortune, estimated at more than \$1,000,000, in furthering the cause of Poland.

The Prince of Wales this afternoon called on President Wilson and was allowed to see him, as the president continues to improve.

According to present arrangements the railroad bill now before the house will come to a final vote next Saturday, November 15th, when it is planned to adjourn this special session of congress.

The San Francisco board of supervisors has adopted a resolution requesting the United States government to withdraw the injunction against the strike of the coal miners. The vote on the resolution stood 17 to 1.

The Methodist Ministerial Association of Southern California at a meeting in Los Angeles yesterday protested against the tour being made of the country by De Valera, president of the Irish republic, who is to speak in Los Angeles on Wednesday, November 19.

It is feared that transportation in some sections of Canada will be seriously crippled if the snow storms now in progress continue. Winnipeg is experiencing the heaviest storm in years, and in southern Manitoba three feet of snow is reported.

HUSBANDS ARE HOPING

Recently an Irvington woman invited a few of her friends to play cards during the afternoon. There was a strong intimation that the highest score would be rewarded with a prize. That stimulated interest to a degree.

The women had visions of the ordinary prizes given for card proficiency. One of them thought of a nicely hemmed towel, another saw visions of a cut-glass tumbler and still another dreamed of something else. There was but one table and as the hostess was barred the contest was wholly between the remaining three. Finally the games were over and the scores tabulated. Then the hostess came in with a big glass of currant jelly and presented it as the prize of the afternoon. She had picked the currants in her own garden and had made the jelly herself.

There is hope in the hearts of some Irvington husbands that the fad of giving real food as prizes will grow. Then, if their wives are good enough bridge players there may be something to eat when husbands come home in the evening.—Indianapolis News.

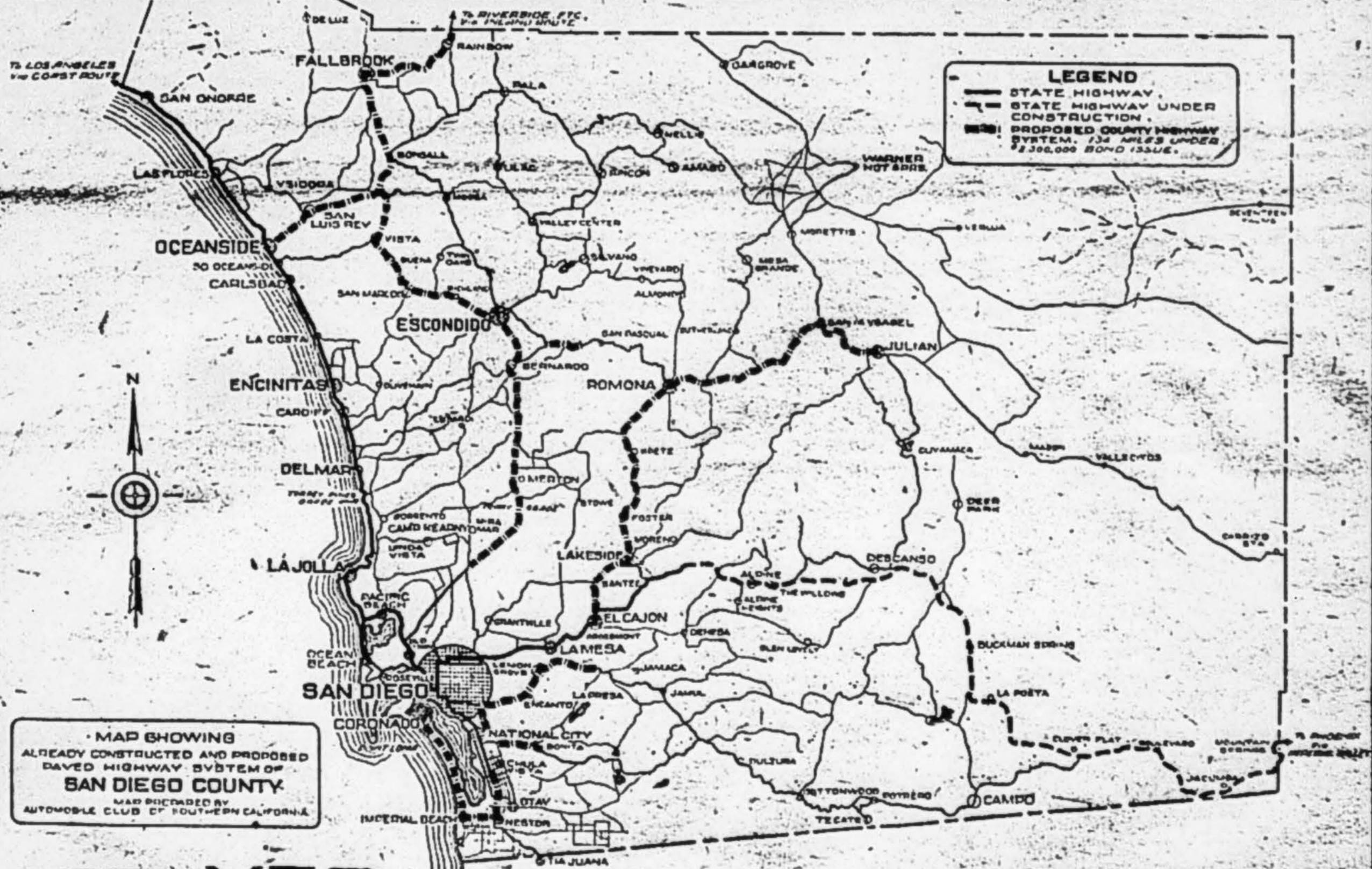
