UC San Diego's Gastrointestinal Endoscopy program was recently recognized by the American Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy (ASGE) as one of the top 56 endoscopy units in the country. The ASGE Endoscopy Unit Recognition Program is a new program specifically dedicated to promoting quality in endoscopy and honoring those units that follow the ASGE guidelines for quality and patient safety.

An important component of the program is an educational course that thoroughly reviews related guidelines. Upon completing the program, units receive an ASGE "Certificate of Recognition," which is granted for a three-year renewable period. The program applies to all settings in the United States where endoscopy is practiced, including: office-based endoscopy units, hospital-based endoscopy units, and stand-alone ambulatory endoscopy or surgery centers.

Only four such programs in California were recognized this year, including the UC San Diego GI Endoscopy Unit.
