UCSD Extension Offers Two-Day Course That Explores Public Space

SAN DIEGO—Town squares, promenades, and parks have been vital elements of everyday life for five centuries. "Interpreting Public Space," a mini-course examining past and future interpretations of urban public space in the San Diego/Tijuana region, will be presented through the UCSD Extension on Nov. 14 (6 to 9 p.m.) and Nov. 15 (9 a.m. to 5 p.m.).

The course will be taught by Lawrence Herzog, Ph.D., professor of City Planning and Latin American Studies at San Diego State University and visiting professor in the UCSD Graduate School of International Relations and Pacific Studies, and Jorge Orzono, M.A., professor of Architecture at the Instituto Tecnologico de Monterrey, Queretaro campus.

The course will include site visits to **inSITE97** venues and will lead participants in creative exercises at selected public places that will help them think about traditional, modern and post-modern design as it relates to public places.

The course is sponsored by the Center for U.S/Mexican Studies, UCSD, inSITE97, the Liberal Arts and International Programs of UCSD Extension; and the TransBorder Institute, University of San Diego. The course fee is \$45.
