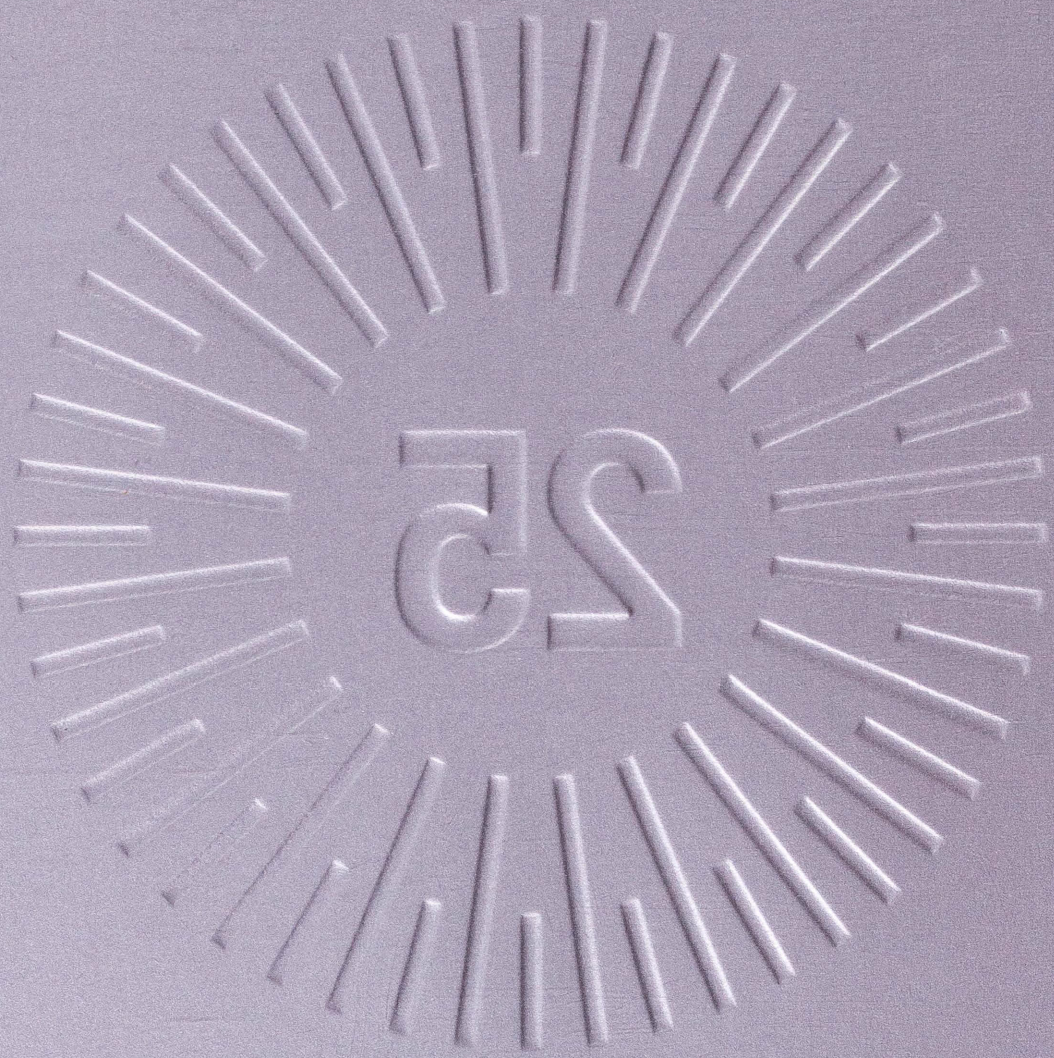




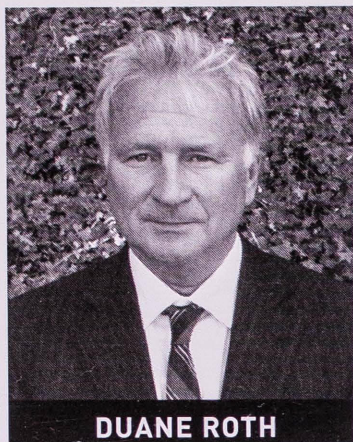

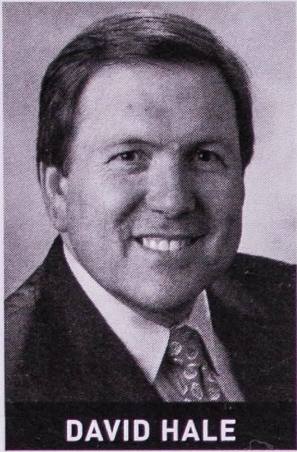

It has been my pleasure to serve as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of CONNECT for the past six years. As Chairman and one of the original co-founders of CONNECT, I would like to thank all of the individuals and organizations that have been instrumental in the success and growth of CONNECT over the years, and who continue to support our efforts as we move forward.

When a small group of us founded CONNECT in the mid '80s, the San Diego regional economy was in crisis. an opportunity to transform San Diego's growing research capabilities into commercially viable products and businesses that would ultimately increase the prosperity of the region.




Marvin Hamlisch's life in music is notable for its great versatility as well as substance. As composer, he has won virtually every major award that exists: three Oscars®, four Grammys®, four Emmys®, a Tony® and three Golden Globe® awards; his groundbreaking show, *A Chorus Line*, received the Pulitzer Prize.

Hamlisch is the composer of many motion picture scores including his Oscar®-winning score and song for *The Way We Were* and his adaptation of Scott Joplin's music for *The Sting*, for which he received a third Oscar®. His prolific output of scores for films include original compositions and/or musical adaptations for *Sophie's Choice*, *Ordinary People*, *The Swimmer*, *Three Men and a Baby*, *Ice Castles*, *Take the Money and Run*, *Bananas*, *Save the Tiger* and his latest effort *The Informant!*, (Sept. 2009) starring Matt Damon and directed by Steven Soderbergh.

Marvin Hamlisch holds the position of principal pops conductor for the National Symphony Orchestra, Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra, Colorado Symphony Orchestra, Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, Seattle Symphony and San Diego Symphony. He was musical director and arranger of Barbra Streisand's 1994 concert tour of the U.S. and England as well as of the television special, *Barbra Streisand: The Concert* (for which he received two of his Emmys®).

As a graduate of the Juilliard School of Music and Queens College (where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree), Hamlisch believes in the power of music to bring people together. "Music can make a difference. There is a global nature to music, which has the potential to bring all people together. Music is truly an international language, and I hope to contribute by widening communication as much as I can."

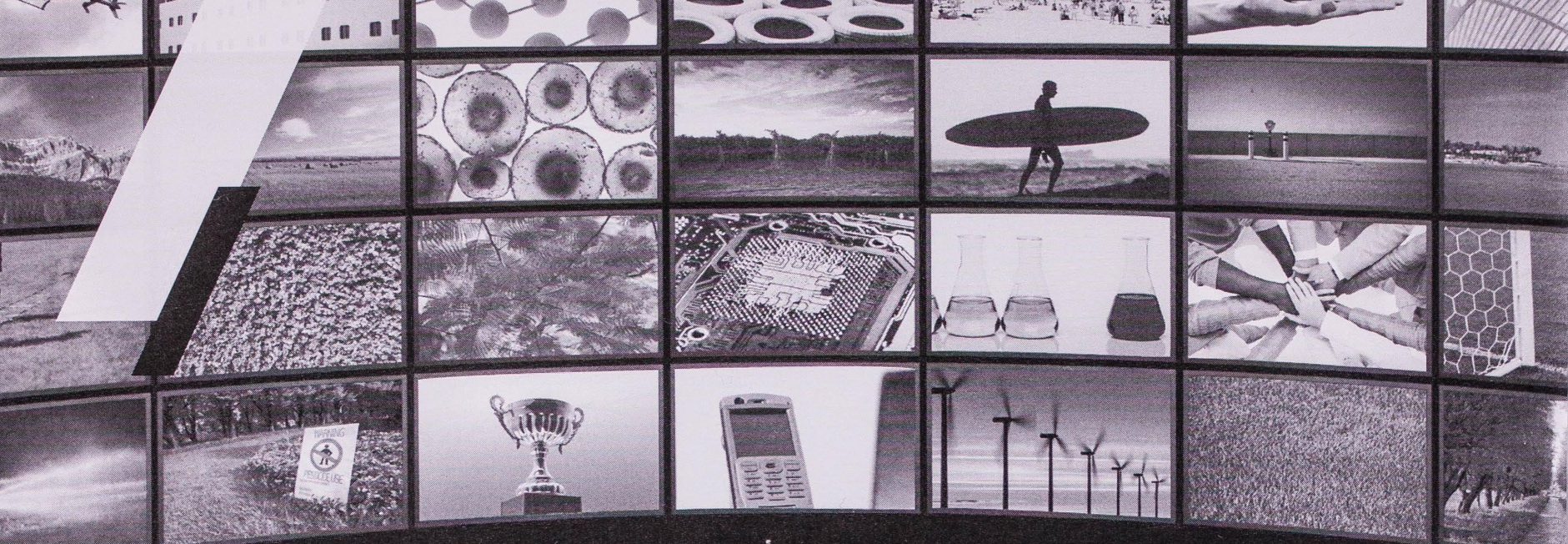
