The $\$ 50,000$. ash in the Treasury is to put the North Mexico Contracting \& Purveying Company in first-class shape so that its stock can be sold; or exchanged, at par, for the stocks of the Companies that it assists to establish on Pacipic city site. It is to pay for taking out a charter, printing stock, opening an oifice, transferring Pacific City site lands to the Company and for recording the game in Mexico City and Fuerie, staking out and planting trees on the streets of one square mile of Pacific 0lty site, extending Ios Tastes Ditch to the Bay, building a section of the Company's Headquarters, starting the "Topolobampo Weekly," erect.. ing a section of a Department Store (which will seli at first largely on commission) obtaining concessions from Mexico to start a ship yard, to erect a smelter, and to encourage the settling of artisans and others, sendirg an agent to Japan to make contracts for a large supply of laborers for agricultural and other services and to publish and 1llustrate the Company's purposes and pro,
perties in leading papers of America and Burope.
The M. M. C. P. is to be a contracting and purveying Company to do all kinds of work necessary to develop and to supply a new section of continent, and the basis for its business will be the selling of the 50,000 or more residence lots, and the leasing of the factory, store, whare, and truck garden areas on Pacific City site. The Company w111 be the contrector to build residences and structures on Pacipic city site, and the purveyor to furnish materials and supplies for the same.

It is suggested that the Company sell the resident lots in
series of 480 lots (10 Blocks) at Pixed prices, and give the persons ready to bulld the. Prast cholee ol lots, and use $60 \%$ (see Paper No. 4) of the money reeeived from the sale of resident lots and leases to improve Pacilic City site and for the benedit of the gettlerg. The Company to have its own engineers, architects, constructors and artisans under salary and to do all kindsof work and to supply all kinds of materlals for say $10 \%$ (ton per cent) over actual cost.

To attract at once 500 heads of faxilies to build substantial and pretty homes on the Pacipic 0ity site, it is sugeested that the Company agree to set aside $10 \%$ from the sales of all resident lots in Pacific Gity site to pay sald pioneer home builders pro rata with the cost of their lots and residences. Also to set aside, from the $60 \%$ above mentioned, funds to secure the settler's homes from lots in case of fire, and the settlers themselvea In case of illness, accident, or death.

As soon as 500 residences are built on Pacifle City site, Pacilic city can take out a charter for a home-ruled city under the laws of Mexico, and thus incorporated, can become an mportant factor to co-operate with the $\mathbb{N}$. M. O. P. in the upbuilaing, with order and system, of this great manufacturing and commereial terminal for reilroads and steamships.

These first 500 residences constructed by one company w 111 glve a domand for manufactured material sufficient to inaugurate 2. series of home industries and to plant them permanently on PacIfic city site and at once. The average cost of these homes will be probably about $\$ 2,000$. This would give $\$ 1,000,000$. for the 500 and $50 \%$ or $\$ 500,000$. of this can be counted upon for the cost
of the materials used. These materials would be mainly brick, tile, terra cotta, coment, glass, lumber, doors, sash and cabinet work, stone, sand, Iime, paints, rugs, furniture, hardware, and assorted goods and roods. Therefore the N. M. C. P. will advertise for a brick, tile and terra cotta out-fit with foreman to go, at once, to Pacific Oity site. The IN. M. C. P. to take $40 \%$ of the Brick Company's stock, at par, pay elther in cash or to give Lts stock at par, for the same, to give iree during 20 years, the lease of one block, $600^{\prime} \mathrm{X} 450^{\prime}$ on Pacific oity site to establish the plant; to guarentee to exempt the plent and its products, Ror 20 years, from muntcipal taxation, and to asree to buy, at a rate of gay $10 \%$ over cost, the brick, tile and terra cotta that the com. pany makes that the $\mathbb{N}$. M. C. P. can use for constructions on the Pacific olty site. In IIke manner, it is sugsested that the M. M. C. P. merge its interests with a department atore company, glass factory, saw will, door-sash, and cabinet work lactory, Inme burners outiti, cotton mill, tamery, shoe manufacturing company, smelting company, iron furnace, ioundry, fish-catching-curing-canning outfit, wheelwright, ship wright, paper mill, etc, etc., and In every case to encourage the employes of these companies to buy Lots and to build homes in Pacific City and to take stock in the N. M. G. P. and in the industries in which they find employment. Such a "community of interests" between all the companies and all the pergons employed, or engaged in the settling, in the laym ing out, and inthe building up of a great metropolis will be exceptionally attractive to home builders and to investers, and therefore the enterprise must prove of large and quick profit to all concerned. Especially will it be of importence to Sinaloa and
to Mexico to see quickly and substantially built, on the shores of the Gulf of California, a city of greatness and influence in the exchanges between North America and the Pacific nations, and therefore Mexico's encouragement may be largely counted upon for the inauguration of Pacilic city and its early industries.
