

Dr. Stanley Miller is PILS lecturer

Dr. Stanley Miller, professor of chemistry at the University of California, San Diego, will present the fifth lecture in the Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series to be held at 4:15 p.m. on Thursday, May 1, in the Humanities-Library Auditorium, Revelle College.

"The Origin of Life on the Earth" will be Dr. Miller's topic.

Dr. Miller received a B.S. degree from the University of California, Berkeley, with highest honors in chemistry. He worked on his doctorate at the University of Chicago under the direction of Nobel laureate Harold C. Urey, now a member of the UCSD faculty.

He was a Frank B. Jewett Fellow at the California Institute of Technology and was an instructor and assistant professor of biochemistry at Columbia University from 1955 until he joined the UCSD faculty in 1960.

Dr. Miller's research interests lie in the synthesis of organic compounds under primitive earth conditions.

The lecture will be free and open to the public.

The next PILS lecture, on May 15, will be given by Dr. Joseph R. Gusfield, professor and chairman of the Department of Sociology, whose topic will be "Equalitarianism and Education in Two Societies: India and the United States."
