

Bond named Revelle Provost

Dr. F. Thomas Bond, who had served as acting provost of Revelle College at the University of California, San Diego, has been named provost of the college.

Bond, an associate professor of chemistry, was named acting provost following the departure of Chia-Wei Woo, who left in 1983 to become president of San Francisco State University. UC President David P. Gardner approved the selection of Bond as provost last month.

Also, physics professor Dr. David Wong has been named acting provost of Warren College, replacing Dr. Michael Addison, who returned to teaching in the drama department.

Wong, a native of China, has been a member of the UCSD faculty since 1960. A search for a permanent provost will begin during the winter quarter of 1986.

Bond, who joined UCSD in 1967 as an assistant professor of chemistry, has won four campus Excellence in Teaching awards, and is the author of numerous scholarly papers.

He has been active on several campus committees including the pre-med advisory committee, chair of the academic senate committee on educational policy, the chancellor's committee on campus growth and the enrollment projections review committee.

The native of Brooklyn, N.Y., earned his B.S. in chemistry from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and his Ph.D. in organic chemistry from UC Berkeley in 1962.

After spending a year in the U.S. Army as a second lieutenant in a ballistics research laboratory, he joined the faculty at Oregon State University where he stayed five years before coming to UCSD.
