UCSD OFFERS EARLY ADMISSION HONORS PROGRAM

The Early Admission Honors (EAH) program at the University of California, San Diego provides the opportunity for exceptionally talented students to enroll concurrently in UCSD courses for credit while they complete their senior year of high school.

Early Admissions Honor students may take up to two courses per quarter at a cost of less than one-third of the usual tuition fees. Those students who decide to continue their studies at UCSD on a full-time basis after high school graduation may do so without filing another application for admission to UCSD. The application deadline is January 31, 1996.

Courses taken in EAH become a permanent part of the student's academic record and grades are assigned according to usual University of California standards. According to Patricia C. Reiswig, EAH coordinator, "All UCSD academic services are available to EAH students, including tutoring, the use of the UCSD library facilities, career services and the Office of Academic Advising."

The purposes of the EAH program, Reiswig said, are threefold: To provide advanced courses for students wishing to follow a particular subject beyond the level offered in high school; to provide advanced courses not offered in high school, and to provide a gradual transition from high school to the college environment.
