

Earl Warren Symposium to be held; Ramsey Clark to give DeWitt Higgs Lecture

"Liberty and Justice for All" is the theme for the Earl Warren Symposium to be held from April 29-May 2 at the University of California, San Diego. The symposium is co-sponsored by Warren College and the San Diego County Bar Association in observance of National Law Week.

The symposium will open with Ramsey Clark giving the DeWitt Higgs Lecture at 2:30 p.m. Monday, April 29, in room 110 Peterson Hall. The topic is, "Individual Rights: Achievements and Challenges." A reception will follow.

Clark has served under two federal administrations. In 1961, John F. Kennedy nominated Clark assistant attorney general, a post he filled until 1965, when Lyndon B. Johnson named him deputy attorney general. He then served as attorney general from 1965-69. Clark currently has a private law practice in New York City and in Washington, D.C.

A panel discussion entitled, "Hard Cases: Equality for Women," will be held at 7 p.m. Monday, April 29, in room 103 Peterson Hall, featuring Dr. Barbara Winters, a former UCSD professor of philosophy and Dr. Kristin Luker, an associate professor in the Department of Sociology. Luker is the author of the recently published book, "Abortion & the Politics of Motherhood."

Several San Diego attorneys and a member of the San Diego Police Department will meet at 7 p.m. Wednesday, May 1, in the Warren Apartment Commons to advise students of their rights in the event of an illegal search and seizure relating to alcohol and illegal substances.

A symposium featuring panel discussions, film and moot court sessions with dramatization by the UCSD drama department will focus on the issue of capital punishment, from 9 a.m.-3 p.m. Thursday, May 2, in the Mandell Weiss Center for the Performing Arts. Drs. Tracy Strong and Peter Irons of the political science department will moderate.
