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

(A) INTRODUCTION.

This updating area study should be read in conjunction with the 1972 initial Area Study compiled for this area by Mr. C.D. KACONAGHY.

(B) POPULATION - DISTRIBUTION AND TRANSMI.

Appendix 'A' and patral report jacket refer.

Appendix 'A' figures are divided into three groups. They are!

(i) Persons Living in the villages (ii) Persons living in Daru and other locations within the electorate, and (111) Persons living outside the electorate. The population therefore, for the area patrolled is the first column total of 2403. Almost all the persons living elsewhere in the electorate (i.e. the ascent column) are in fact living in Daru. A recent census of Daru Island itself should cover these people.

The 2405 persons living in the villages represent 54.2% of these villages. 1353 people, or 30.6% live inside the electorate but outside the village, and 674 people or 15.2% live outside the elect rate. The overall abjentee figure for the villages is thus 45.8%. This absentocian is adequately explained in the initial Area study.

Following are a list of villages and respective figures for persons working in Torres Strait.

From the Appendix "D' language groupings it can be established that of the 462 student attending the High School, 283 students or 61.3% come from the DANK Sub-District. This figure does not include the language group "Others" (8.3%) which probably would be students with Daru residing parents.

Approximately 6 to 7% of adults (not school-chidises) is villegee can read and write English.

The Churches at KABARA and KATATAI have still not been completed.

(I) MON-INDICAMES.

Further to information in the initial area-study: Mr. T. HOLLAND of MADIRI Plentation has approximately 200 pigs and 80 head of mattle.

Mr. WALTER KARBAN spent some time with the SUI villege people buying bar amundi from them. Whis intentions were to make SUI village his headquarters and continue his enterprise on a larger scale. Currently Mr. Karlan is not at Sui and the above plans x may not be implemented.

Latest developments with the Gulf Enterprises Prawn Processing Factory are not known, however, they have just completed building a freezer set-up on the Daru foreshore, to store the barrawndi they purchase. There are up to 135 crayfishermen catching grayfish for Gulf Enterprise's. Gulf Enterprises do not employ these men, however, they may help then to get to the reefs by touring them behind one of the small beats.

The Daru retail stores (Durms Philp, Bernies Store, Western District Store and Wing Hoi) provide work for a number of people.

(J) GOMMONICATIONS.

Roadst There are no roads in the area (apart from Daru Is.), nowever, the Kimi Council has received \$150.00 R.I.P. on a \$1 for \$1 basis for a MABADUAN/SIGAMADURU road. As three or so miles of this stretch is essap, and communications are easily unde by cames or foot, the justification for the project must really be something.

distances from the share are not over-estimated. Further information on sea communications may be found under section (R) Kiugi Local Covernment Council. There are good wharf facilities available at Duru.

(K) TECHNICAL AND CLERICAL SKILLS.

The recent talks on a Mational Youth Services may also result in comething for the young sen and some in the area. A Committee of inquiry has already toured districts to find out different views on this subject. Hopefully, the results of the inquiry will be "forthcoming soon".

(L) THE STAGE OF POLITICAL DEVELOPMENT.

I would consider that generally, the p PM3 political situation is roughly known by the people in the West Riwai area. There appears to be little concern about the political future of the country. For an experiment (which may or may not be open to criticism). I did not mention politica during the patrol. As a result, absolutely nothing was said to se, or any other person on the patrol, concerning politics (apart from Council matters that is). This must indicate something.

(H) THE ECONOMIC POSENTIAL OF THE AREA AND POSSIBILITIES OF EXPANDING THE SCONDEX.

The West Kiwai Arem is one which is entirely coastal. This factor rather restricts economic potential, Naturally enough the main industry is fishing. Apart from the limited market gardening and copra producing potential the greatest future for the area consequently lies with the fishing industry.

Following is a list of existing and possible industries:

- . Darramundi
- . Grayfish
- . Salt dried fish (Three dfin Salmon)
- . Shell collection (Pearl, Trochus etc.)
- . Assorted fish
- . Miscellangous (Crabs, Beach-de-mer, corals etc.)

Each of the above will be discussed under its own section.

of all the economic prospects for the mest Rival area, the burremundi industry sould have probably the greatest potential. In this area to date, the majority of burramundi cought has been in the area between the Sinaturi River and fore Passage and along the coast north of Fore Passage. The former area is restricted and open to only indigenous fishermen.

The following figures are interesting. From 1/9/71 to 31/8/72 barramundi precessed (frozen) for the Western District was:

If the above values for the two years were based on the retail price for fillets of approximately the per lb, there values would be doubled, given fillets = approx. 46% of whole fish.

MOTH: Daru Freezers include: Gulf Enterprises, Bernics Store, Burne Philip and Jack Duyer.

Freezer Boats includes Viking B. Lehatoi, Parama, Mamoi and Florence.

Village Pressers include: Bosset (for Lake Eurray Area) and Sanaki (operating in East Kiwai Area for 72/73 year only).

From the figures a it can be seen that last year's barramendi catch was considerably less than the previous year - a drop of 37%. This initially would seem to indicate less fish being taken in the hets this year however, this may not have been the case. *A definite contributing factor would have been the severe drought last year. This had at least two consequences:

- . the swamps in the Somest area dried up extremely rapidly, thus causing the Besset fishermen to cease operations in about August.
- . the rapid drying-up of the amamps cauced the barra to signate south a masse and local fisherum and freezers just could not handle the bulk. Buch fish was caught and much was wasted by going bad.

Host infortunately I do not have figures for earlier years to offer a more comprehensive comprison of eatches.

To fully realise the problems involved, the life cycle of berrasundi in given:

000016

Mature barramundi (i.e. 4 to 5 yrs old or about 8 lb wt.) migrate annually to such areas as the Fly River (Lake Harray etc.) Sidimo, Beimuru and Kikori. This movement taken place early in each year. The barra stay in these areas until about August they then start their migration back to the Daru area to breed, beginning to arrive at about the end of September. They Constally keep rowning till about February. The breeding ground for the barra line between SIMABADURU and JARAI (Morehead Sub-District) - refer exetch map appendix "H". Barramundi must spawn in salt water and consequently there is no breeding up the rivers. From Rovember to February the female barra, heavy with roe, begin to open, with the males fertilining the eggs. Finin 45 hours the eggs hatch and the fry make their way to the protection of the coastal sameps. Aere they remain until the escening dry season drives them out between April and August. Should there be the occasional extended a vet season, some fish may stay in the slamps for a year or se.

To ensure that the barramundi industry maintains a rosy future in the area, and does not follow the example set by commercial karramundi ventures in queensland and other plates, proper protection measures are obviously very necessary. The effect that fishing has had so far on the barra population cannot be readily assessed, as an accurate study has not been going on long enough. Over the last few years, however, intensive remearch has been carried - out in the Western District by Fisheries and the valuable information sollected (from which most of this section of the report has which most of this weeking of the report has some from) should not be disregarded.

The real danger to the industry is the extermination of large numbers of small barramundi, thus limiting the number of fish that will reach maturity for breeding. Appendix 'I' covers the Solution to this possible that restrictions may be necessary to control the fishing will the usridionsenson. It is obviously desireable that sufficient numbers of of week sigs. It ros - laden barra reach the breading grounds. Netting thus could be prohibited till later in the season than late September. may till early November or so. Crayfish are still plantiful at this time of year, therefore money earning acitivities are not ourtriled (refer section on Grayfish).

> There will be a very large psychological factor involved if the most is to be made of existing barrasundi resources. The Kismi ficherach are traditionally an easy-going people. Maximus output, increased yield, scaring profits, etc. etc. fall to raise their interests to a very great degree. This way of life is good - so long as it can be maintained without incurring permittion later on. Traditional fishing mothe is have of course, largely been put aside with the introduction of the barramundi gill note, however, the very necessary associated appreciation of having to effectiently use there note has been disregarded in many cases. Fishermen tend to be too sasy - going in the cheeking of their nets, and many fish are wasted because they are bad by the time they reach Daru. The incidence of fish wastage is particularly high when fishermen, having left thear mote still set, stay in Daru - generally on pay weekends.

Organisation of fishermen into 2 co-sps may seem a likely move. however, the history of the now definet Kismi Fiching Syndicate with its standing deficit of \$6000 should be care atudied before any similar type ventures are undertaken. Brie/ly, the trouble with the Syndicate was:

- . Too many persons involved in the one scheme
- . Insufficient operation of M.V. AVON
- Distance sty amongst syndicate members
 Lack of strong leaderships
- . Initial D.A.S.F. enthudass broke down.

There are a great many lessens to be learned from the unfortunate Kiwai Fishing Syndicate. Should another scheme be contemplated in the future, such information can be obtained by scanning through the Fishing Syndicate fite held by D.A.B.F.

GRAYFISH:

The current price given by Gulf Enterprises for crayfish tails is \$1.40 per 1b.. At average crayfish tail sould weigh about 1 lb or maybe clightly less. For the industrious crayfisherms there is good money to be made.

Gulf Enterprises state that their crayfish catch for last year was about 50,000 lbs. They estimate that it would be about 30,000 lbs this year.

Different boats from time to time have gone out to the reef with a string of canous and diaghies in tow. Perhaps the most consistant of these boats sould be the Culf Coterprises launch "Mosine" and their dory "GEA".

The technique used for catching cryfish is by handspearing from a camps or dinghy or by spearing whilst diving. As far as can be ascertained, all attempts to catch crayfish in pots have failed.

Extreme care would have to be taken to set up a crayfish cyndicate or such-like.

There is a very big potential for the expansion of the erayfish industry - resources are adequate for expansion but improved techniques and equipment sould be accessery. A degree of solid research in this direction sould not go astray.

SALT-DRIED FISH (Threadfin Selmon or "GAISA"):

Salting and sun-drying is a very old method of processing fish (and other meat) for storage. Should an industry such as this develop in the Darm area, the fi a used would be Threadfin Salmon, locally known as "GAISA".

Processing procedures for salt-drying the fish are briefly as follows:

- The fish are caught in hand houled 1%" to 1%" mosh beach seine nets, gute and gills are removed and the fish are liberally rolled in salt. This must be done fairly soon after netting, as "Malsi" goes off very quickly. After being closely stacked in crates overnight to allow solid penetration of the salt, the fish are hung in a drying store for a number of days. When the fish are dried completely, they can be stacked and stored for several months.
- It is estimated that 1 lb of saltfish equals approx. 2 lb fresh fish. There is a limited market of 2 to 3 tons per month in Sydney and an unlimited market in S.E. Asia. A figure of 60¢ per lb could possibly be received by the "exporter" in Daru. Compared with barranundi, saltfish would probably return alightly less mency to the fisherman, however, with saltfish no refrigeration is involved. Bearing this in mind, the exporter's propercentage payout to fishermen could be more than for barra, and including the fact

that with saltfish the heads are also processed, return for barra and saltfish could be such of a muchaess.

"Galsa" are fishable twelve menths of the year and exist in large numbers. Transportation would be no problem as the fish could be salted on a small scale and stored until a decent quantity was obtained, then taken to brue for sals. Calculated out, the cost of salt per pound of saltfish is very small.

Shou'd a saltfish industry be contemplated, it is suggested on authority that it be introduced on a small project basis established in one village. Solid Fisheries supervision would be a must. If the project proved a success, other villages could be assisted.

For a small scale project, initial requirements would be:

. i 20° x 10° drying store consisting of a slab of concrete with a clear plastic roof (away from trees so that it would not by damaged by falling objects) and flywire sides. The lailding frame could be constructed out of round timber.

Satisated cost of materials = \$250 upprox.

. One 1%" or 1%" mean 18 to 14 ply 150 yd. beach seine net.

Estimated cost = \$200 ap rox.

Total setimated cost = \$450.

Saltfish could also be used on a subsistence basis. If used in this way various binds of fish could be prepared, apart from just threadfin salmon. It could take a while for this food to be accepted locally. For preparation the fish should be scaked in fresh water oversight then to scaked in fresh water oversight then served with rice, in soups, stews etc.

SHELL COLLECTION:

There is small potential for collection of pearl, trochus and other shell. Pearling on a large scale might be possible but is currently unlikely. Current prices are:

Black-lip pearl shell Trochus (not defective) 30c per 1b 5c per 1b

Steamships are prepared to buy the shell at Daru sharf. Payment would be made to the supplies via Sup-District Office or any other suitable way.

ASSERTED PIGEV

The going price for fish at the Darn Market is 15c per 15. This provides a good say for fishermen to pick up a bit of change. All types of fish are bought and sold.

MISGELLANDOWS:

There are a number of other things such as crabs, yabbies, beach-de-mer, tuna, corals, etc. which may or may not have potential in the area. At this stage, however, there does not seem to be such future here.

(O) ATTATUDES TOWARD LOCAL GOVERNMENT.

Village people in the Kiwai Council Area are generally not over - impressed by their council's achievements. Considering the many years (17) that the Council has been operating, there is little material benefit in the villages to show for it. Appendix "B" lists the Council's evident assistance for each village.

Accompanying the patrol was the Council Tax collecting team and the Council's Executive Officer, Mr. Babadi Sawasi. In all, only \$95.00 was collected, out of a possible figure of near \$5000 (a little of this mensy may already have been paid). No tex defaulter prosecutions veromade, simply because the tax committee felt that it would be unjust to tax people for no remem. This was a wise decision, and more or less confirms the thought that the Mivai Council is virtually only the Daru Town Council now, as far as rural services go. There are one or two villages which have received benefits from the Council recently (Mg. Sabaduan with its PTS) but these are exceptions and I feel sure that tax exceptions, unless very deserving, will not be given in such a case.

I shall discuse the eltuation of the Kimm Kiwei Council later under Section (%).

(P) ATTITUDE TOWARDS SENTRAL GOVERNMENT.

People have a basic understanding of the workings of Central Government, but interest is not great, generally speaking.

(Q) ACCOMMEDITION, SERVICES AND FACILITIES.

Area Study susmary applicable to the Geneus Division still applies, however, listed below are facilities available in Daru. There is only one hotel in Daru, the Gerebus Area. Accommodation is reasonable at \$16.00 per day, all mesls inclusive. The hotel can accommodate 30 gurets.

Apart from the Hotel, accommodation is limited to private residences, the Oriomo/Bituril.S.G. transit bouse (mainly for use of persons from that area, but not necessarily), and the Goubined Gouncils Quest House (\$28,000 to complete - KLOG share is \$8772). The latter creation is situated near the airstrip, has five rooms, but is as yet, unsupervised. Anyone wishing to stay there has a hard time tryin, to find who to see about it.

Apart from P.S.D. and Marida, there are no well - equiped workshops in Daru. The Kirai Geuncil and various private concerns in the town do offer bacic workshop facilities.

Virtually all supplies for the area, including timber, gravel and other building materials, came from fort Boresby.

There are a number of privately - owned work-boats and disghise available for hire in Darn. These are usually fairly expensive to acquire.

There are a number of privately - owned work-boats and dinghies available for hire in Daru. These are usually fairly expensive to acquire.

The Kiwai Council offers trucks, tractors, a utility and a cement mixer for hire, at reasonable rates. Other Council services include: Stovedering, Town Clearing, Sanitation and Garbage, Airfield Maintenance and Caltex Agency.

(R) KIRAI LOCAL GOVERNMENT COUNCIL.

The Kicai Council is the Local Government representative for the West Kiwai people. This Council is repossible for looking after the last (up to a point) of these villagers. Over the years seemingly very little has in actual fact been done for the villages (Refer Appendix '8'). This state of affairs reached a peak cror the last year, where virtually sothing at all was done. To emphasize the point: In a recent Council secting it was suggested that the Fly River delta villages (Rivai & Island etc.) break away and form their own Council. The situation with the Riwai Council is serious and currently is cauving concern, but it is by no means hopeleds.

Perhaps it would be best to look at the finances of the Council first (as per 1973/74 let Revised Estimates).

The estimates are fairly straight forward and in the Recurrent Revenue only a conservative \$13000 tox tax (plus \$2300 back tax) has been allowed for. This conservativism could be very wise, as there is a general reluctance by the village people to pay tax (Refer Section (0). ATTITUDE TOWNERS LOCAL GOVERNMENT). To date, \$4044 tax has been collected from all areas in the Council. The Council's capital works programme is quite limited this year, with many of the projects having been carried forward form last year. The shortage of money is a little hard to understand. The \$17177 estimated for recurrent expenditure seems oversuch, and the \$7,000 profit estimated from the Council Project Services (i.e. Transport section, stevedoring, Town Glearing, Sanitary and Carbage, Airfield Maintence, Gultex

out of a total revenue for the Project Sérvices of \$74,718, does seem a rather small amount. I am aware of a certain degree of inefficiency amongst Council staff, and this probably contributes largely to the degree of success of the Council's financial involvements. Although its easy to say, the Council, and is particular the CouncilProject Services, needs to be strummlined. This would not be an easy task, considering there is no Administrative Advicer (the Executive Officer, Mr. Babadi Edwami, is doing his bestto cover the work of an advisor).

With the increasing dissent of village people towards the Council it is evident that to do its job properly the villages have to be visited, whether for the building of Council Projects or just taking round the sail and purchasing garden produce and cours. The only say this can be done effectively is by bost. The Council's most recent attempt to do this was disester, with the purchase of the morkboat N.V. KIWAI. This venture cost the Council thousand of dollars initially, and the boat only undertook a handful of voyages before seriously breaking down. More thousands were sment on getting the engines going again, only for it to be discovered that the vessel was falling apart. The N.V. KIWAI now joint other relics on the Daru foremaker, just in front of the market.

Research into annual maintenance costs for ten Dara Administration vessels, averaged out over a three year period, discloses the following information:

The average annual maintenance cost for one (1) Administration vessel, therefore is \$2145.

APPENDIX "1

PROPOSED FISHING REGULATIONS TO APPLY WITHIN THE KIWAI LOCAL GOVERNMENT COUNCIL AREA AS BY LAW OF THAT COUNCIL.

REGULATION (1).

No fishingent not with a mesh size less than 65" may be used unless covered by exemption 1.

EXEMPTION (1).

Note of mesh size 12" to 2" may be used provided they are hauled and at no time fixed in one position.

REGULATION (2).

Any fisherman wishing to a haul not allowable under exemption ? must:-

- (a) Register the net with the Department of Agriculture, Stock and Fisheries, in Daru.
- (b) Ottain a legal minimum size "stick" free D.A.S.F.,
- (a) (kerry the stick with him when fishing.
- (4) Release all barranumed smaller than the stick.

REGULATION 13).

No barramundi under 15" tetal length to be lauded in Daru, whether fresh or preserved in some manner, nor may they be sold commercially sutside of Daru.

The legal minimum size stick will be 15" long, equal to a fish of approximately 18 hb. although barromunds are not macure until they are 4 lb. a large % of the fish will have migrated from the area by the 15" stage. It is also emsidered that a fish of 18 lb. is large by local standards.

REGULATION (3)

The object of this regulation is to prevent undersized fish caught by sain (local poison root) and other allowable methods, from breezing commercial.

Extensive damage is caused to the juvenile barramundi population by the use of aidi in the bracking grounds. This is a traditional method of subsistance fishing in swamp areas where other methods would be ineffective. Provided that there is no numerical outlet it is assumed that damage from this source will not increase.

At present three fish, particularly in the smoked form, are sold on Daru and Saiboi Islands.


SALLING CATABARAN/SORESCAT.

The attached photostat short gives rough details on a possibly suitable satamaran design for the Kiwai Souncil area. The cost of materials has been ammended by the designer. For the same beat this figure is now \$6000, however, for a workboat finish, probably the cost of materials would be less.

if each a craft were to be built, probably this sould best be done in Daru, where building standard and progress could be readily shacked. I do not think that the Council would be carable of doing the building themselves, therefore a private contractor would most likely get the job. His price could be in the vicinity of \$2000.

Should the Council favour the idea of such a bost, they could make a Rural Improvement Submission for a total grant for the project. Considering that there is very little else for R.I.P. monies to be allocated to the Council (i.e. there are no roads, bridges etc). there would be a fair chance of succeeding with such a submission.

The picture, inset, chars a 34' catamarun of a like design to the 40' overleaf. The beat could be rigged with a gaff sail layout (in line with mota-mota design) and man red by a cres of three. As the importance of going from place to place in the shortest possible time is not great in this area, there would not be any used for an auxiliary engine (to have one sould only complicate matters in fact).



P. BOURAGA Secretary MISSIONS.

Since last year the new mission group known as the Maranatha have been slowly moving into the Oriomo Bituri area. The strongest hold achieved so far is at Wonie village. It is slowly pushing out the United church. Admittedly the approach is unique for the area, with no pastors or the such, only fellow brothers. Achoehol and tobacco is frowned upon, but unlike the S.D.A. it is not a damning sin to partake.

The Seven Day's Adventist has control of a relatively small section of themarea, being, Abam, Peawa, and Zim.
A school is operated at Peawa, under the guise of a Primary 'T' school. However, it would better and more aptly be named a training centre for potential pastors. Children are flown away yearly to Kikoro for the classes that do not operate at Peawa. No head is being taken of the Governments instruction to promote traditional skills, singsings and the like area still strongly forbidden. The greatest breach of normality is the forbidden consumption of most meat, and source of protein. The S.D.A. airstip at Peawa needs attention.

The Asian Pacific Christian Mission, like the S.D.A. does not have a great hold on the area. Alcohol and tobacco is still forbidden as are traditional outlets. A saving grace being that the people are at least allowed to eat whatever meat they chose. They have a strong hold on Upiara village.

The United Church, the oldest in the area, is still the strongest. Traditional outlets and skills, if not encouraged are certainly not discouraged. Traditional dress is the only thing frowned upon. The United church controls the majority of the population in the area. Generally speaking they are more down to earth, and a little more with the times. There is a lot less intimidation, and personnel are generally greatly respected if not loved.

This matter is being closely watched by this office and the Dept. of Business Development. The SAKURU Brothers have moved to their new location on their own land. Have not recommended cane production but expect to start early in August based on the 8 Point Plan.

The 'Giri-Ganoian' Club is a Social Club set up in the village with Social and Economic aims with useage rights to all members of the village. The Club and in particular Barry DOBE expected the SAKURU Brothers (Parapo and Dugi) to contribute all the profits of their lucrative and successfull came furniture business to the Club. The dispute broke out as the Brothers were only prepared to help the Club with the end result that they have moved their families to a new location.

Barry DOBE is now working for the DARU Hotel as a barman the Club although having a lot of support from the young people is not well organized and badly needs a leader. The loss of the SAKURU Brothers will be sorely felt, as well as the fact that one of the Brothers wives was the woman teaching the women how to make pandanus basket. A production that has a big market in DARU.

No repercussions from the move has been noticed yet.

Subject: Village dispute - Girenarede

- 1. The possibility of a dispute between the members of the GIRI-GANOIAM Club and the SAKURU brothers of GIRENGAREDE village was investigated. It was found that a problem in fact existed between the brothers and the village owner, a man called BANY DOBI who is employed at the Daru Hotel, Daru.
- chair making project and also run an independent trade-store. The only other trade-store in the village is now owned by the GIRI-GANOIAM Club. This latter trade-store is accombination of two stores previously run and owned by BARRY and the other man DIPU. Both these stores were being run at aloss as both these men faced restocking problems, largely due to a lack of ready cash and shipping difficulties. On the other hand the SAKURU brothers have an 18H.P. outboard powered cance, with which they ship thier completed chairs to Daru, and on the return trip bring in fresh supplies for their trade-store. Their cane chair business also means a steady income of ready cash.
- BARRY owns most of the land on which the village now stands and his brother owns land from which the villagers extricate their supply of logs for the construction of their conces. BARRY has indicated that unless the village people stand behind him, this supply could be cut off and problems could also arise regarding village houses which are situated on his land.
- 4. The GIRI-GANCIAM Club was established a few months ago with an aim to make money and use these funds to assist students to attend further education, provide sporting facilities at the village and other village improvement plans. Most of the village people devote a fair amount of their time in activities which assist this end. The men make carvings and the women weave baskets for future sale. The club also runs a trade-store and now owns a good amount of land upon which the sporting facilities will be erected.

5. BARRY wants the BAKURU brothers to cease their independent tradestore and also their cane chair business, and both of these enterprises to be taken over by the club and the money gained from this take-over to become club funds. He has attempted to apply pressure on the village people as the SAKURU brother shave refused his wishes. They have agreed to spend one day each per wack in instructing the club for a fee of \$4.00 per shipment of completed chairs to Daru. BARRY has refused this and wants a complete club owned concern.

6. The village people do not want to see the SAKURU brothers forced into the club and agree that they should be left to work at their own business in their own way.

7. BARRY in order to achieve his wisnes to have the SAKURU brothers join the club has brought pressure to bear against them through the people by causing problems about land ownership in the village, land ownership in regard to land from which cane for the business is cut and refusing permissin for the brothers to erect a new larger building for the proposed erection of their trade-store.

8. The buisness Development Officer in Daru has discussed these problems with the village people and suggested the SAKURU brothers move from the village and establish a new village - thisis what the brothers intend to do and this is to be carried out in the near future. This will possibly mean at least 50% of the village will move with them and serious financial loss for the newly established GIRI-GANOIAM club through membership loss and support.
