

Lecture on "Brain and Behavior" scheduled at Sherwood Hall

One of the nation's most distinguished psychologists, Dr. Donald B. Lindsley, will speak on "Brain and Behavior" at a free public lecture at Sherwood Hall, Art Center in La Jolla, on Tuesday night, October 25.

Professor of Psychology and Physiology, and Chairman of the Department of Psychology at The University of California, Los Angeles, Dr. Lindsley appears under the auspices of the Theatre and Arts Foundation of San Diego County and the La Jolla campus of The University of California.

The lecture begins at 8:00 p.m. Admission is free. The public is invited.

Dr. Lindsley has held teaching and research positions at Western Reserve University, Brown University, and Northwestern University, as well as UCLA. He is a member of the National Academy of Sciences. His work on radar operation and training during World War II earned him a Presidential Certificate of Merit. He has been awarded honorary D.Sc. degrees by Brown University and by Wittenberg University.
