MAGARIDA PATROL No. I of 1959/60.
MAILU and DIMUGA Census Sub-Divisions.

PATROL DIARY.

Monday 9th November.

Patrol departed from the MAGARIDA rest-house and moved 200 yards to the rest-house in KULELE village.

Nineteen fifty eight census revised and 1959 personal taxation collected.

Amount taxation collected £85.

One new shotgun permit no. I2287 issued to JOSEPH/ALAVE.

No complaints. Patrol remained overnight in the rest-house.

Tuesday 10th November.

Patrol from KULELE to WOWOLO rest-house - 40 minutes along the beach. Census revision and £61 personal taxation collected.

New issue Special Arms Permit I2288 KIPORA/LO of WOWOLO.

A few minor complaints attended to, patrol camped in the village.

Wednesday 11th November.

Across the WOWOLO lagoon by canoe to SELAI, 20 minutes.

Tax-Census of SELAI and the small hamlet of ORAORO. Tax collections £42 and £12 respectively.

New Special Arms Permits issued - I2289 MARK/BONIO and I2290 PAPU/A'ATE both of SELAI - I2291 O'OBU/GOAI'A of ORAORO.

No complaints.

No rest-house at SELAI, the rest-house at WOWOLO serves jointly that village, SELAI and ORAORO. Patrol camped in village houses, O.I.C. in the co-operative store.

Thursday 12th November.

From SELAI patrol followed track along the beach, over ridge to AROANA. Thence by canoe across the bay to DEREBAI village. Total travelling time about one hour. S.A.P.'s I2292 - I2294 issued DEREBAI.

Tax-Census of both AROANA and DEREBAI. Collections £36 and £34.

Patrol slept DEREBAI. Both rest-house and police barracks here.

Friday 13th November.

From DEREBAI patrol returned to MAGARIDA per canoe. No wind trip 3 hours.

Patrol Officer assisted Native Labour Inspector Mr. W.Hansen with inspection at MOGUBU Plantation.

Saturday 14th November.

Patrol remained MAGARIDA.

Sunday 15th November.

Patrol at MAGARIDA.

Monday 16th November.

Patrol resumed. Patrol now leaves the MAILU coast for the inland DIMUGA. Per foot WOWOLO, canoe ORAORO, foot again to NUNUMAI village, total time $3\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

Patrol reached NUNUMAI about 1300 hours, census deferred until tomorrow.

Good rest-house and well sited overlooking the MALOLIA River.

Fresh-water fish and shrimps plentiful.

Tuesday 17th November.

Tax-Census of NUNUMAI and smaller hamlet of BILAGA.

Collections £15 and £6.

DIARY cont.....

New issue S.A.P.'s I2295 to AIAPAN/PALAP of NUNUMAI and I2296 to BOETA/BARABARAI of BILAGA.

MALOLIA River forded above NUNUMAI and thence by gently ascending track to DERIA village, $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

Patrol slept at DERIA rest-house.

Wednesday 18th November.

Census revision and tax collection DERIA. Collections £17.

Small coffee planting inspected.

No applications for shotgun licences.

Patrol by track following sides of river valley to KERIA village, $2\frac{3}{4}$ hours.

Camped KERIA in newly constructed rest-house.

Thursday 19th November.

Tax-Census of KERIA and DOVETA. Collections £26 and £19.

No applications for shotgun permits.

Patrol by steep native track to DOGON via DOVETA, three hours.

MAILU island visible at several points on the track between DOVETA and DOGON.

Rest-house at DOGON small and uncomfortable. To be repaired.

Friday 20th November.

DOGON 1958 census figures revised and £19 taxation collected.

No issues of Special Arms Permits.

From DOGON to KOMANIA rest-house. Track very steep with two sharp creek crossings. Three and a half hours.

Rest-house fair. Light rain during the night.

Saturday 21st November.

Tax-Census KOMANIA No. 1 and No. 2. £50 and £31 collected.

No applications for shotgun permits.

Councillor KOGE of KOMANIA No. 1 resigned position and new councillor DOBAKAI/TARIAP elected.

Airstrip inspection (letter 2/I-I of I5/I2/59 refers.)

Patrol remained KOMANIA rest-house.

Sunday 22nd November.

From KOMANIA by track ascending steep ridge and then very abrupt descent to EVIAUA.

Census revision and £29 tax collected. No shotgun permits. Patrol continued on down the valley to TOPU. Total walking time KOMANIA - TOPU, four hours.

Poor rest-house at TOPU and infested with fleas from rotten timbers.

Monday 23rd November.

Tax-Census TOPU, £17 collected. No applications for shotgun permits.

Two and a half hours following the river valley down to IOIOK.

Newly constructed rest-house here on a small plateau overlooking the river. Census deferred because of heavy afternoon rains.

Tuesday 24th November.

Tax-Census of IOIOK, collection £34. Patrol continues down the valley past fairly extensive alluvial river plains to ARAU.

Special Arms Permit No. I2297 issued to MADIANI/AGURENI of ARAU.

Walking time IOIOK - ARAU $2\frac{3}{4}$ hours. Walking easy.

Wednesday 25th November.

Tax-Census ARAU, £33 collected. Further level easy walking to

DIARY cont.....

MAGORI via the small hamlet of LAUA. Walking times, ARAU - LAUA $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours, and LAUA - MAGORI 2 hours.
Patrol slept at MAGORI rest-house.

Thursday 26th November.

Census and tax of LAUA and MAGORI, collections £8 and £31.
Special Arms Permit No. I2298 issued to OGELA/VELAVE of MAGORI.
Patrol by foot to the beach at DEBA and thence canoe to DARAVA.
MAGORI - DEBA foot $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours, DEBA - DARAVA canoe with fair wind,
3 hours.

Friday 27th November.

Patrol from DARAVA at 0600 inland track to BONUA, four hours of flat and easy going mainly through forest. Latter stages through more open country.
Tax-Census of BONUA, collected £34.
Patrol slept BONUA rest-house.

Saturday 28th November.

Patrol back to DARAVA and along beach to MAGARIDA, nine hours.

Sunday 29th November.

At MAGARIDA.

Monday 30th November.

At MAGARIDA.

Tuesday 1st December.

Patrol returned DARAVA per MV 'MAGI', $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours. Tax-Census of smaller hamlet LABU, collection £22.
Patrol slept at DARAVA rest-house.

Wednesday 2nd December.

Tax-Census conducted of DARAVA. £80 collected.
No shotgun permits issued. No complaints.
Remained DARAVA rest-house.

Thursday 3rd December.

From DARAVA by sailing canoe to DEBA. Adverse winds and trip took six hours.
Tax-Census of DEBA, collection £28.
LOBO/BAIRE provisionally appointed Village Constable of DEBA following decease of former Village Constable MARI on the 28/8/59. (Letter I4/3-2 of 15/12/59 refers.)
Patrol slept at DEBA rest-house.

Friday 4th December.

From DEBA by sailing canoe to LOUPOM island $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours.
Tax-Census LOUPOM, £90 collected.
Slept LOUPOM.

Saturday 5th December.

Canoe to LALUORO, 40 minutes. Tax-Census LALUORO. Collected £113.
Special Arms Permit No. I2299 issued to WAVIRA/WORO.
Patrol slept LALUORO rest-house.

During the recent Nomination Patrol carried out in the area, see Special Report MAG 2-59/60, special attention was given to the possibility of establishing vehicular roads.


From these observations, the following comes to light.

The road from ORARO to NUNUMAI is excellent and with the exception of two small hills is suitable along most of its distance for vehicles. It is intended, in the near future, to survey road sites round these small hills. Also there is the possibility of linking the road to MAGARIDA; this too will have to be surveyed.

From NUNUMAI to DEBIA is flat for most of the way, but the road crosses several creeks. Most of these are small and shallow, but the MALCLIA River near NUNUMAI would be impassable during flood. However, during most of the year it is shallow and can be easily crossed.

The Road from AMAU to DEBA is good but crosses several hills which present quite a problem. This could be opened up at a later date as the volume of produce from the area increases.

The DARAVA/BONUA road is good and would take little work to make it suitable for vehicles.



NORA to TANOBADA, a very unpleasant walk. An hours climb out of NORA and then three hours of steep slippery descent to coastal plain three thousand feet below. By far the worst days walk in the Sub-District. The whole trip takes seven hours. Or nine hours going the other way. The latter should not be attempted, there is no need for it, and it is not fair for the carriers. Held a nomination meeting of KIBEI and TANOBADA. Camped for the night.

Saturday 27th.

From TANOBADA to ILI where a nomination meeting was held. Then on to ORI. Arrived at ORI at midday to find noone there. Returned to MAMAI arriving there at 1800 hours. Stayed the night.

Sunday 28th.

Mr Chalder of MAMAI very kindly gave me a lift to ONEONE. Nomination meeting was held, and the Patrol camped for the night.

Monday 29th.

Walked through to MAGARIDA arriving 1830 hours. Nomination meetings held at SABIRIBO and BONEBO on the way.

Tuesday 1st March to Monday 7th.

At MAGARIDA.

Tuesday 8th.

Departed MAGARIDA with Mr Haviland for SE AI and DERISAI to assist in surveying store sites and collecting data as per Circular Instruction 235. Stayed the night at DERISAI.

Wednesday 9th.

To MAILU to survey store site. Assisted Mr Haviland with stocktake of the store. Owners of the land absent so will have to revisit Mailuat a later date.

Thursday 10th.

Departed MAILU late afternoon and stayed the night at LOUPOM.

Friday 11th.

Returned to station.

Saturday 12th and Sunday 13th.

At MAGARIDA.

Monday 14th.

Departed per M.V. MAGI for DARAVA. Held nomination meeting and stayed the night.

Tuesday 15th.

To BONUA to hold nomination meeting, and returned to DARAVA. The DARAVA-BONUA road is good and could be made vehicular with little trouble. Departed DARAVA for DEBA.

Wednesday 16th.

Returned to MAGARIDA.

Thursday 17th.

At MAGARIDA.

Thursday 17th cont.

Departed MAGARIDA for MODAULO to take nominations. This village is a long way from GABURU and I suggest that next year it has its own representative at the Council. Stayed the night.

Friday 18th.

Returned to MAGARIDA.

Saturday 19th to Tuesday 29th

At MAGARIDA. During Tuesday afternoon, the patrol departed for BAIBARA per the M.V. MAGI. Arrived at the rest house at ORI at 1900 hours.

Held nomination meeting of ORI and OIBADA villages. Spent the night.

Thursday 31st

Departed ORI for MANAI. Road under flood up to three feet deep. Two rivers had to swim. Spent the night at MANAI.



PATROL DIARY NO.5

Tuesday November 3rd- 1959- Bulk of Patrol gear and Native staff departed for Sogeri Patrol Post. Self departed by Land Rover 1900 hours for Sogeri Patrol Post. Stayed night with O.I.C.

Wednesday-Nov.4th- Departed Sogeri Patrol Post by Land Rover 0800 hours Arrived Owan's Corner 0845 hours. Departed on foot 0900 hours and went down to EGOFI Creek. Crossed and climbed a short distance to UBERI Village (H 1300 ft). Arriving at 0945 hours, easy walking. Camped for night.

Census, tax and routine administration. One request for SAP. People stated they are not interested in Councils. Everything in order.

Thursday -Nov 5th- Departed UBERI, 0640 hours walked over a good track for a short distance. Track then deteriorated becoming narrow and slippery. Climbed sharply to a mountain pass and descended very steeply over a slippery track to the Valley floor. Followed and crossed numerous small streams and finally climbed steeply to AUWAIABAI'WA Village at 1500 ft. arriving at 1040 hours. Camped.

Census tax and routine administration. Everything in order.

(This Village is also known as "Camp 44" it being one of the army camps during the Kokoda campaign. However, the actual camp site is at the foot of the pass).

Friday-Nov 6th- Departed AUWAIABAI'WA 0640 hours. Immediately climbed steeply over a grassy ridge in a northerly direction. Track then went down steeply to the OBI river. Crossed and climbed sharply to the crest of the mountain. Thence went down along a ridge to NAORO Village (H. 2,200ft) arriving at 1240 hours. Camped. Census, tax and routine administration. An excellent village, well sited and laid out. Everything in order. People stated that they were not interested in Local Government Councils.

Saturday- Nov. 7th- Observed at NAORO. This being a Seventh Day Adventist area. Completed book work.

Sunday-Nov.8th- Departed NAORO 0700 hours. Proceeded along a level track following the NAORO river downstream. Finally crossed the river and continued downstream arriving at MADILOGO Village (H 2,000ft) at 1010 hours.

Easy walking through track could be still further improved. ELOLOGO Village also assembled here for census. Camped. Census, tax and routine administration of both villages.

ELOLOGO Village intend combining with MADILOGO in the near future. Alternatively it could have been included in the Vanapa division as it is on the direct patrol route, whereas, if the people change their minds and remain in the present site it is necessary to detour in order to visit the village.

One case of severe malnutrition sent to Hospital.

Monday.-Nov 9th-1959- After some delay departing HADILOGO. 0940 hours. Climbed steeply to the mountain crest at 3,000ft. The track along and around a ridge, following it down and then descended sharply over a slippery track to the HEBARIGA creek. Crossed and climbed a short distance to MANAROGO S.D.A. Mission school (H.2,000ft).

Inspected school and children (about 50 students and 2 teachers).

Departed MANAROGO mission and went down to the VABUIAGI river. Crossed where the FAGUME river joins it and followed the latter upstream climbing steadily steeply at times and crossing several small tributaries. Finally descended easily to ENVILOGO village (H 2,550ft) Arriving at 1335 hours. Camped. Heavy rain during the afternoon prevented taking of census and tax.

Inspection of village when rain ceased. Everything in order.

Tuesday- Nov. 10th- Completed Census and tax collection. Departed 0900 hours. Descended to the FAGUME river. Crossed and proceeded over several small ridges and streams. The track then climbed sharply to 4,000 ft. and descended equally as sharply the other side to HAILOGO Village. (H, 3050 ft) arriving at 1130 hours.

Census, tax and routine administration. Everything in order. Heavy rain during the afternoon.

V.C. is a sick man and wishes to resign. A tentative replacement was made but no recommendations will be submitted for a while. Learnt here that the direct route to DUBI Village no longer exists and that the people were at MANUMU.

Wednesday- Nov. 11th- Departed HAILOGO 0710 hours. Descended sharply over a slippery track to the GAUGA creek. Crossed and climbed steadily to a mountain pass at 4,000ft. the track improving. Track then deteriorated and went steeply to the OVEIA river. Crossed and climbed over a good track through a small patch of gum country. Went sharply down for a distance and then walked through approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles of undulating grass country following the MAOROBEGO river upstream. Finally entered the timber again and climbed steadily to MANUMU Village (H 2,000ft), arriving at 1230 hours. Camped. DUBI also assembled here.

Census, tax and routine administration at MANUMU. Everything in order. A non-mission village. Heavy rain during the afternoon.

The grass patch through which the patrol passed would be suitable for a station and air-strip site (for light aircraft, in the first instance). The strip would run in approximately an East/West direction with good approach. It is very near the air route to KOKODA, which could not be more than 20 minutes flying time away. The area is well watered.

Thursday- Nov. 12th- At MANUMU. Census, tax and routine administration, of DUBI Village. Everything in order. Non mission village. This village is combining with MANUMU on a new site near the grasslands mentioned above. Preparations have already begun. If the move takes place there will be no need to re-open the direct route between HAILOGO and DUBI.

Friday- November 13th- Departed MANUMU 0700 hours. Back-tracked to the OVEIA river. Crossed to the junction of the HAILOGO and BORIDI tracks. Followed the BORIDI track over numerous ridges crossing many small streams. The track then climbed steeply to a ridge and descended to another small creek. Finally climbed steeply-passed through BORIDI Village onto the rest house (H.3,450ft) above it. Arriving at 1130 hours. Camped. Slight rain.

Census, tax and routine administration. Everything in order.

Saturday-Nov. 14th- Observed at BORIDI. Completed book work.

Sunday- Nov. 15th- Departed BORIDI 0705 hours. Climbed over a good track to the crest of a mountain. Thence the track followed up the ridge climbing steadily-steeply in parts- to the top of the ridge at 5,200ft. Then descended over a steep slippery root covered track to a small spring (RIUMA). Continued on downwards crossing the PAPUABO and HANATHLE creeks. Finally the track flattened out and crossed the FAGUME river to BODINUMU (H. 3,400ft) a short distance away, arriving at 1000 hours. Camped.

Census, tax and routine administration. Everything in order. People stated they are not interested in the Local Government Councils.

Heavy rain during the afternoon.

Monday- Nov. 16th- Departed BODINUMU 0730 hours. Crossed the FAGUME river again upstream and climbed steeply over a slippery track to the ridge at 3,800 ft. Followed the ridge down gradually and descended sharply to the LAILI river. Crossed and climbed steeply to another ridge. Followed it down to ODOA (Kagi Village) (H. 4,350 ft) arriving at 0845 hours. Camped. NADUNUMU people assembled here.

Census, tax and routine administration of the combined KAGI villages of EGURU and GAMOLI.

NADUNUMU also completed. Inspection of same and KAGI S.D.A. Mission school, 1/2 hours walk away.

(This is the nearest rest house to KOKODA. Approximately 1 1/2 days walk away).

Tuesday- Nov. 17th- Departed ODOA rest house, 0645 hours. Descended along a good track for a short distance. Then went down sharply to the EFOGI river. Crossed and climbed steeply to a ridge. Thence followed the ridge eventually climbing to LAUNUMU Village (H 4,400 ft) arriving 0815 hours. Inspection of same. Departed 0830 hours and descended sharply to the KAVEI river. Crossed and followed a good level track to BAGIANUMU (H. 3,700 ft) in the EFOGI area arriving at 0850 hours. Camped.

Census, tax and routine administration of BAGIANUMU and LAUNUMU. Everything in order. Both good villages especially the former. Possible air-strip site here.

Wednesday- Nov. 18th- Departed BAGIANUMU 0705 hours. Crossed a small creek and climbed sharply. Followed a narrow track around the side of a mountain to a ridge. Followed the ridge down over a good track thence a sharp slippery descent to the VABUIAGI river. Crossed and climbed a short distance to MANARI Village (H 2,300ft) arriving at 1000 hours. Camped.

Census, tax and routine administration of the combined villages of EMOIA and VADULOGO. Much bickering over the final site of the village which is at present split into four sections several hundred yards apart. Consequently housing etc. is extremely poor and the rest house the worst encountered on the patrol so far. Several orders for rebuilding of houses given and people told to make up their minds re a suitable site as soon as possible. A good site was shown to the Patrol and it approved. Several people, including a councillor, do not approve the site but the reasons given were not considered to be valid ones.

The people urged to give a village re-building program first priority after preparation of their gardens, this bickering has been going on for the past three years.

Thursday- Nov. 19th- Departed MANARI 0720 hours. Crossed the EMONE Creek and climbed for a short distance. Followed around and down a ridge and descended steeply to the valley floor. Then walked over a good level track, crossed the NAORO river and joined the NAORO/ MADILOGO track. Continued upstream arriving at NAORO Village at 0950 hours. Camped.

People not interested in Local Government Councils.

Friday-Nov. 20th- Departed NAORO 0715 hours and returned to AUWAIABAI'IWA arriving at 1235 hours. Camped. Rain during the afternoon.

Saturday-Nov. 21st- Observed at AUWAIABAI'IWA . Constable despatched to Sogeri to arrange the transport.

Sunday-Nov. 22nd- Departed AUWAIABAI'IWA 0630 hours and returned to UBERI arriving at 0925 hours. Met Land Rover at OWERS CORNER and returned to PORT MORESBY.





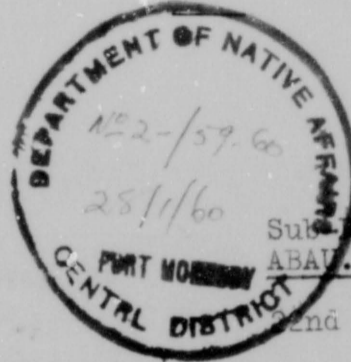

In accordance with your instruction I4-I2-I, 30-I-I3/1003 of the 31st December 1959, I have to advise that I have commenced the Nomination Patrol of the AMAZON BAY (proposed) Native Local Government Council area.

It has not been possible to bring this patrol to a completion in the time available before my departure for ASOPA. Those villages which have been visited to date are, LOUPOM, LALUORO, MAILU, DERREBAI, AROANA, WOWOLO, SELAI, ORAGRA, NUNUMAI and BILAGA. This leaves 27 villages in the proposed council area, DEBA, MAGORI, LAUA, DARAVA, LABU, DERIA, KERIA, DOVETA, DOGON, KOMANIA No.1 and No. 2, EVIAUWA, TOPU, IOIOK, ARAU, TANOBADA, ILAI, MADAUORO, GABURU, KULELE, BOREBO, BOHUA, SABIRIBO, ONEONE, OIBADA, DEIGAM, and NORA to be completed by my successor on his arrival at MAGARIDA.

Details of the nominations received from the ten villages visited by the patrol are appended hereto. In all there were 13 nominations for the six positions as Members.

The people throughout the area have been advised that the elections will be held as shortly after the completion of the Nomination Patrol as is possible.

MAGARIDA Patrol Report No. 2 of 1959/60.

DIARY.

Monday 11th January 1960.

Patrol departed from MAGARIDA by canoe to LOUPOM Island one hour. LOUPOM Nomination meeting had been held the previous Tuesday and the two nominations MANU/BABA'A and MIKI/DAU had been received.

The Co-Operative Officer at LOUPOM, Mr. Haviland, and self held night meeting to discuss with the village people proposals for the leasing of village land on which to erect permanent co-operative stores. This meeting was attended by members from the LOUPOM, LALJORO, MAILU, DEREBAI and KULRELI Societies. All delegates to the meeting appeared satisfied that the Administration should lease $\frac{1}{4}$ acre blocks for a 10 or 15 year period, and in the event of a closure on the part of the Society, the land should revert to the original owners.

Arranged with the Village Constable for canoe transport to MAILU in the morning.

Tuesday 12th January.

From LOUPOM to MAILU by canoe three hours. Many people absent from the village and the nomination meeting arranged for the following morning. Big preparations here for a forthcoming feast. Several Courts for Native Matters arbitrated during the afternoon.

Patrol slept rest-house.

Wednesday 13th January.

Conducted the Council Nomination meeting and received three nominations, KGARA/OMAGA, DOJU/WUNUA, and TORURE/SAMARA, all males. Good attendance at this meeting.

By canoe from MAILU to LALJORO one hour.

Thursday 14th January.

Nomination meeting held, two nominations BORO/DAU and WARIBA/WORO. It was also arranged at this meeting that the LALJORO people should make for the MAGARIDA post a large sea-going canoe to be purchased for an amount up to £50 depending on the size of the canoe when completed. These people have a reputation as skilled canoe makers and seem eager to do the job.

By canoe to DEREBAI one hour. Many people absent from the village and the nomination meeting arranged for the morning.

Friday 15th January.

Three nominations, MORE/DOMARA, OVEA/GEHA and ORAI/BAI'A received from the DEREBAI and AROANA people.

From DEREBAI the patrol proceeded by canoe to ORARA village and thence by foot to NUNUMAI village. Total time about three and a half hours.

Patrol arrived at NUNUMAI at 1500 and the meeting of the NUNUMAI and BILAGA group arranged for the morning.

Patrol remained night at NUNUMAI rest-house.

Saturday 16th January.

Nomination meeting at NUNUMAI. Two nominations BUA/MODA and LUGUE/KETOM.

Patrol from NUNUMAI to the rest-house at WOWOLO.

Nomination meeting conducted in the afternoon nomination single only for SELAI, ORARA and WOWOLO groups, GUTBERT/MAGGONA.

Slept rest-house.

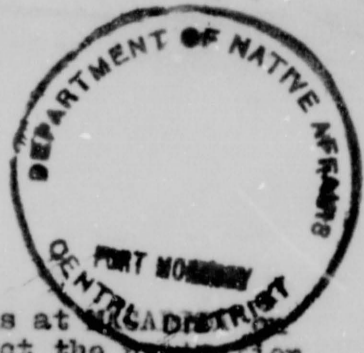
