

UCSD Summer Session

May 6, 1985

Registration for the 1985 UCSD Summer Session is in progress. Even though Summer Session at the University of California, San Diego receives no financial assistance from the State of California, a full complement of undergraduate courses will be offered in practically every academic discipline. With one or two notable exceptions, the courses will be taught by UCSD faculty.

Formal admission to the University of California is not required to attend Summer Session and attendance does not constitute admission for the academic term.

Qualified high school students are eligible to attend Summer Session and approximately one hundred fifty enroll each summer. In general, high school juniors with B+ grade-point averages have the background necessary to undertake the lower division courses offered in Summer Session. Honor students will, in most cases, have the requisite preparation to undertake upper division courses with the permission of the instructor.

The Summer Session courses are the same as those taught during the academic terms at UCSD. They carry full credit toward graduation from UCSD and other campuses of the University of California. Though one educational institution cannot guarantee that other institutions will grant credit for its courses, it is likely that courses taken at UCSD would be accepted by most other institutions throughout the United States. Students who plan to transfer credits to another institution should obtain in advance approval from the home institution to make sure that the credits will be accepted.

Summer Session can also be part of an overall plan for students to reduce their course loads during the academic term to make room in their program for a part-time job, to participate in athletics or other extra-curricular activities without risking their academic records, or to concentrate on fewer courses. In response to the needs of students who must work during the day, UCSD Summer Session will offer 41 courses that begin after 5:00 p.m.
