

HELP! I'm drowning. P.S. I just did.

Here comes the perennial school assignment: WHAT I DID THIS SUMMER.

I asked my local nursery man and the answer was "a SATSUMA plum", and yes it will do in semi-shade and yes it can handle adobe soil, and yes it will still thrive with spotty watering. So OK, a few years back I paid \$5.99 for a spindly unpromising bare-root Satsuma plum tree. Insuciantly I dug a wee 12-inch hole in my rock hard adobe soil. Colder weather came. You must understand it was a San Diego winter and it rained a bit. As the saying goes:

Spring comes in the summer Summer in the fall Fall comes in the winter And winter not at all.

Early spring followed. "How you doing?" I asked in my best broken Japanese. It answered with a sprig of tiny white blossoms. Early summer it had set fruit: 3 plums. Actually 4 but one shriveled and fell off. I choked back a tiny oriental tear. "Good girl," I said, "you're making me very happy." Soon it was fall, which comes sometime between December and March. The tree shed its leaves, dutifully, and then it was spring again. "How you do now?" (My Japanese vocabulary is limited.) It answered with a small cloud of white blossoms. Just beautiful! I gathered my small family of one to view and admire it, after which it set 26 plums. Yum.

And so the years passed, with every year triple and quadruple the number of plums, often breaking a branch here and there, so heavy with fruit it was. We ate plums. I gave away plums. The pruning was a propitious move. My SATSUMA slowed down a little come summer. We harvested a reasonable number of plums, indulging ourselves consuming the jam, chutney, relish, syrup, pulp, defrosted cakes, puddings of the previous year. "Nice going," I said to my tree. It was the millennium. Everybody understands that. I did not say it in Japanese.

The year 2001 dawned and that summer brought a deluge! Not rain, mind you. PLUMS! Plums, plums, and more plums. While I have always envied the Noah family and their wondrous collection of animals, tethered, I hope to masts and railings or roaming about freely below deck, Mrs. Noah no doubt in pursuit with her scooper, her I did not envy. Ah so, plums is better, I hummed in elementary Japanese.

Plums, plums, jam, jam, jam, relish, relish, relish, etc. (See above.) I gave plums away to neighbors, the mail man, friends, more friends (even those across town, as well as those living in the boonies). I secretly slipped bags of plums with my payments to the grocery check-out ladies. When I noticed that my friends and neighbors were drawing their blinds and locking their doors when they saw me approaching, I left bags of plums under their garden bushes. We ate more plums, delighted to see raccoons, rats, skunks, squirrrels, birds, etc. sharing our bounty.

Noah still scanning the skies for the possible last of the pterodactyls while Mrs. Noah still wielding her shovel and about to hang out the wash (plenty of water here): a double take! Sees an Alonythectoptopotus (a precursor of our modern dove) alight on the rail. What more she groans. 
