#### PATROL INSTRUCTIONS - AIRSTRIP KONO DIVISION.

Confirming verbal instructions previously given to you, please be prepared to depart on this patrol this week. You may take Emanuel Tuka, Assistant Field Officer, and two Police Constables, with you.

- 2. The object of this patrol is to locate an airstrip site in the vicinity of Oria Village in the inland Kono Census Division. As you know, the people of Botulai, Sulukunu, Oria, Orimai, Pagui, and Ububakogi, are now beginning to produce a significant amount of cocoa, and have no way of getting it to the coast because of an absence of communications or transport facilities. The small population (about 1200) and the hilly terrain makes road construction non-feasible, and it would seem that the best method of transporting cocoa from the area is by air. Missionary Aviation Fellowship is keen to get into this type of operation in Bougainville, and costs would work out at about \$33.00 per ton. Back-loading could also be utilised for trade store goods.
- 3. The people of the area have already expressed their interest through the Buin Local Government Council, in the development of such a strip and their willingness to build it by hand. Our role initially is to locate and mark out a suitable site for a Category "C" strip 2000' x 200'. This department will also have to provide supervision and tools. There will be no payment for labour.
- while in the area, I want you to inspect a strip which the people of original village (an S.D.A. village) have started on their own initiative. Measure it, take a compass bearing of the centre line, and make an assessment of its potential for further development. I have inspected the strip from the air. It appears to be too short and prospects of development do not seem to be favourable because of unsatisfactory local terrain.
- 5. Look at every strip site which the people show you, and decide which is the best one. You should measure the length and width of terrain suitable for development, take compass bearings, check the site for alignment with prevailing winds (NW SE), and take into account other factors such as approach clearances, drainage, vegetation, surface, etc. As much of the supervision will be carried out by officers of this department, you should also select a suitable site for a camp.
- 6. Other factors which will influence your final selection of a strip site will be (a) the development later on of feeder roads from cocos areas to the strip, and (b) proximity of main cocos producing areas to the strip. To assist you in this respect you should ask the Agricultural Officer for cocos census figures for the area.

7. On your way past Tabago I would like you to call upon Father Fingleton and mention the objects of your patrol to him. Fingleton himself has been concerned about advancing the economic welfare of the people of this area, and at one stage contemplated the use of donkeys for the transport of cocoa. This idea has practical limitations. I think that he has now abandoned this scheme and viewed favourably the possibility of building a strip in the area when I mentioned the idea to him some time ago.

8. Do not hurry the patrol. I want you to spend a minimum of ten days in the area carrying out a thorough survey along the lines mentioned in the preceding paragraphs. When you feel that you have completed the objects of your patrol, report your findings to me.

and proximity of main cocoa producing areas to the strip were also observed during this patrol. A suitable site for a camp was also to be selected during this patrol as much of the supervision work in constructing the airstrip will be carried out by Officers of this Department. Opportunity was given to inspect another category "C" airstrip site, which the people of ORIMAI village have started on their own initiative.

The area patrolled is one of the more isolated portions of the Buin area. It lies approximately to the east of Buin town on the foothills of the Crown Prince Range and is bound by the headwaters of LULUAI river and ABIA river. The topography of the area is very undulating with numerous rivers and creeks cutting deep valleys between ridges. The rainfall in the area would be in excess of 100 inches per year. Soil types would appear to be very good as indicated by the excellent quality of cocoa planted in the area, and the vegetation in the area consisted of heavy rain forests.

The patrol was conducted by me C.J. Tabua, Patrol Officer, and accompanying the patrol were; Mr.E. Tuka, Assistant Field Officer and two members of the Royal Papua and New Guinea Constabulary, Constables BRUNO and IGINAS. The patrol lasted for ten days from the 19th. February, 1969 to the 1st. March, 1969.

Being a patrol of a special nature not all the headings as set outin Departmental Standing Instructions Volume 1 will be covered in this report.

- 19/2/69: Departed BUIN at about 0900 hours for ORIA village in the inland KONO Census Division by car and foot via TABAGO Catholic Mission .

  Arrived ORIA village via UBUBAKOGI village at about 1500 hours .

- 20/2/69:- At ORIA village. Held meeting with the people re the airstrip site in the vicinity of ORIA village. Thence went out to inspect the airstrips sites proposed by the people. Returned and slept ORIA rest house.

27/2/69: - Departed ORIMAI village at about 1330 hours after a heavy rain for ORIA village and arrived at about 1630 hours . Slept ORIA rest house .

28/2/69: - Departed OnIA village at about 0700 hours for TABAGO rest house via villages; UBUBAROGI and TURITAI and arrived TABAGO rest house at about 11.30 am . Slept TABAGO rest house .

1/3/69: - Departed TABAGO rest house at about 11.00 am for BUIN by car . End of Patrol .

#### CATEGORY "C" AIRSTRIP SITE \_ ORIA VILLAGE :-

The only site which the people of ORIA village choosed themselves and showed the patrol for the proposed airstrip was located about 100 feet away from ORIA village itself. The proposed site was than inspected and found to be suitable for a category "C" airstrip. A compass bearing of 90 degrees east and 270 degrees west were taken so that the site was in the position with the prevailing winds (NW - SE). The length and width of terrain suitable for development was then measured (2000'x200'). A further 1000 feet was measured on both ends of the airstrip site so that the bush can be cleared out for approach. One half of the vegetation on the strip site consisted of old garden sites and the other half was mainly of rain forest consisted of primary and secondary growth. The drainage of the area selected for the airstrip site was good and the surface was fairly flat continuing for a fair distance on the ridge. The site overall seemed reasonable for future development. Refer to appendix A attached at the end of this report to find the airstrip site ORIA village.

During the meeting held with the af ORIA village re the airstrip site, the people were told that because they have expressed their interest through the Buin Local Government Council in the development of such a strip and that they were willing to build it by hand, our roll therefore is to locate and mark out a suitable site for a category "C" strip and also to provide supervision. It was emphasized to them that there will be no payment for labour. The people were told also that because the area was starting to produce a significant amount of cocoa and have no way of getting it out to the coast, the best method of transporting cocoa from the area is by air, because of the small population of about 1200 and the hilly terrain makes road construction non-feasible. They were told that if such a strip is finished, the Missionary Aviation Fellowship would be keen to get into this type of operation, and costs would work out at about \$33.00 per ton. Back-loading could also be utilised for trade store goods.

The people that the patrol contacted all seemed interested and kappy enthusiastic about the idea on the airstrip site near ORIA village. All the men from the nearby villages came up to give hand when the airstrip site was being marked. The councillor from URIA village spoke on behalf of the people and stated that; they were all happy about the airstrip because their they are tired of carrying their produce on their backs down to the coast. The people informed that they would work on the airstrip on village bases. That is to say that the villages in the area would take in turn to work on the airstrip and would work out approximately 50 to 100 men at any one time.

The Frther in Charge at TABAGO Catholic Mission, Rev. Father Fingleton was also approached and the idea about a category "C" airstrip near ORIA village was mentioned to him. Father Fingleton was interested in the idea and mentioned that he would give co-operate and give interested in the idea and mentioned that he would give co-operate and give any assistance in the construction of the airstrip. He has now abandoned the idea of using donkeys for the transport of cocoa because this idea has practical limitations.



#### ROADS AND BRIDGES :-

Roads and bridges in the area patrolled were looked at and a survey was carried out on the development later on of feeder roads from cocoa area to the proposed airstrip site near ORIA village. Refer to Appendix "B" attached at the end of this report, showing the survey carried out on the possibility of vehicular roads construction from the other villages in the area to the proposed airstrip site near ORIA village.

There is already a vehicular road from TURITAT village to TABAGO village, which continues down to DUIN. The foot track that continues from TURITAT village to UBUBAKOGI village is notsuitable for road construction because of the steep ridge that lies in between the two villages. However the foot tracks that leads on from villages namely; UBUDAKOGI, PAHUI, ORIMAI, and BOTULAI to the proposed airstrip site near ORIA village are suitable for development later on for construction of vehicular roads. The foot track that continues from ORIMAI village further inland to the three villages namely; SULEKUNU, KEKEMONA, and KOUKOUSINO are not suitable for road construction because of the steep ridges and deep valleys that lie between these three villages. Rivers and creeks that need to be bridged and hills that required to be leveled are also marked in Appendix "B".

Overall, it is proposed that the development later onof feeder roads from the main cocoa producing areas to the proposed airstrip site near ORIA village will be from villages viz:- UBUBAKOGI, PAHUI, ORIMAI, and BOTULAI. PROXIMITY of main cocoa producing areas to the strip are attached at the end of this report in Appendix "C".


The main cash crop grown in the area is cocoa, although coconuts and coffee in commercial numbers are still being planted. The cocoa census for 1969 was also carried out during this patrol, however, the cocoa census figures for 1965, 1966, 1967, and 1968 were obtained from the co-operative Officer, Buin, Mr.M.M.Kavanaugh. Refer to the Cocoa Census figures for the area attached at the end of this report in Appendix "B". This census figures show thatat present the production of the area is approximately 48 to 50 tons of cocoa per year. This figure, however is expected to rise enormously in the next few years because of the numerous cocoa tree which have znd been planted and uncountless numbers which are still to be planted.

The people generally are working hard on their cash crops and although one of the more isolated portions of the Buin area the people are in my opinion more progressive and industrious than those in the immediate Buin Town region .

#### CAMP SITE \_ ORTA VILLAGE :-

Because of the fact that much of the supervision will be carried out by Officers of this Department, opportunity was also given during tihs patrol to select a suitable site for a camp where Officers can be stationed to supervise the people working on the proposed airstrip site near ORIA village.

The old rest house site at ORIA village was selected to be the suitable site for a camp because (a). the rest house is close to the airstrip site about less than quarter of a mile away and (b). there was no other suitable site for a camp. The people however, were in instructed to repair the old rest house and the toilet block as they were in bad condition and to build a new house for the policemen as there was no house for the policemen. Refer to the skethh map attached at the end of this report to find the location of the rest house in relation to the airstrip site.







Attached please find original and one copy of the abovementioned report. Because this was a special patrol which had as its object the purchase of the new road alignment between Konga Base-Camp and Boku Patrol Post, there is very little comment to make on the report.

- 2. Since the visit by Messrs. Webb and Kup to the Siwai area earlier this year there seems to have been a definite loss of interest in political matters, debate having returned to more parochial issues. This is true also for other parts of the Sub-District.
- 3. The road purchase is now complete with the exception of "PARANO" in respect of which neither purchase documents nor "B" Requisition was ever received. This matter has been referred to Lands Department in other correspondence.

#### BUIN PATROL REPORT NUMBER 2 OF 1968/1969.

As this Patrol was of a special nature, in accordance with the Director's Circular Instruction of 21st June, 1968, reference 67-1-0, it is intended only to give a situation Report and other information as is thought of importance.

The main purpose of this Patrol was to purchase the land and such improvements therein, that area of land known as the Boku/Konga Road alignment. This was completed with the exception of one Parcel of Land known as "PALANO", these documents not being held at this office at the time of the patrol. Advice has been received from the District Office in KIETA that these remaining documents will be forwarded as soon as they come to hand.

#### DIARY:

TUESDAY 18th FEBRUARY: Irrocceeded to KONGA by car, set up camp in one of the Laurie and Montgomery houses on the Agricultural Station, thence to Siwai Society Office, and informed those people concerned to tell all Land owners and Owners of Improvements for the first three parcels of Land, to gather at Konga Base Camp on the 19th.

WEDNESDAY 19TH FEBRUARY: Whole day spent paying out monies to those people concerned in the first three land documents.

THURSDAY 20TH FEBRUARY: Whole day spent paying out monies to the groups of people concerned in the next two land locumnts, these people mainly from PANAKE Village.

FRIDAY 21ST FEBRUARY: Proceeded by car to the Siwai Council Chambers at AMIO, and swaited the arrival of people from the TONU, TONUI and SIBANAI Villages. Paid out monies to all thosex people as listed on the Land documents. This completed the Konga Investigations, with the exception of PAKANO, which will be purchased as soon as it arrives at Buin. This was explained to the people involved in this Land Purchase, at AMIO.

SATURDAY 22ND FEBRUARY : Observed KONGA.

SUNDAY 23RD FEBRUARY : Observed KONGA.

MONDAY 24TH FEBRUARY: Proceeded BOKU. Set up camp then moved out to villages involved in Land Purchases, and advised all owners to meet at HORIMU Village following Day. Advised those owners on the other side of the PURIATA River to await me at PIKEI Village on Tuesday Afternoon.

IJESDAY 25TH FEBRUARY: Proceeded as scheduled to HORINU in morning, completed purchases by 1100 hours, thence to PIKEI Village, and completed purchases there by 1600 hours. This completed whole of Road Purchase.

Slept BOKU.

WEDNESDAY 26TH FEBRUARY: Departed BOKU for BULN 0800 Arrived BULN 1030:

It is only intended to give a brief summary under the headings of Political, Economic and Social Development as the recent patrol by Mr. Webb and Mr. Kup would give a much more detailed report than would be possible in this report, as the differing objects of the former Patrol dealt more or less specifically with the current Political trends and feelings in the Siwai area. Certainly the abovementioned recent visit of Mr. Webb and Mr. Kup provided a great deal of information for the Siwai people, and to those two officer's credit, a great deal has been absorbed by the people with whom they came in contact. For the first time the interest shown in current political activity was more than the usual half-understood polificalwords which semimore than the usual half-understood politicalwords which semieducated people have a notorious habit of fondly, and often, using
with/understanding the meaning of what they are saying. The interest
in the referendum now that they appear to understand what it means
is something that was perhaps there before, but not spoken so
openly about as it is now.

It is unfortunate that there are neither the field
officers nor visual aids such as a mobile Movie Projector Unit
available to follow up Mr. Webb's lead to good advantage. One of the
main failings of a political education campaign such as is advocated
at present, seems to be the lack of suitable 16 mm films on all
aspects of Government, which could be used through the media of
the Local Government Councils. ECONOMIC: As stated in previous reports of this area, cocoa is the mainstay of the Siwai economy, and present plantings indicate that the Everincreasing yearly output will probably triple within three years. Prices paid by the patrol for economic trees on the Bood alignment were appropriately satisfactory to the expense involved. Road alignment were apparently, satisfactory to the owners involved.

The Road Contractors have at present completed construction of the road, without any surfacing materials, from the Boku airstrip to the Sirokoro river; this section can be used. Past the Sirokoro River they have completed perhaps three miles of road but the surface of this was still very soft and had not been rolled at the time. Subsequent to the patrol it is believed, due to heavy rains in the Boku area, sections of the formed road were washed away. This would be due to the last of confection as a section. rains in the Boku area, sections of the formed road were washed away. This would be due to the lack of surfacing materials, as only sand had been rolled into the formed road Apparently several iron culverts were also washed out on the section near Bolan Patrol Post. The Alignment has been cleared from KONGA to near TONUI Village, and from BOKU to near SINANAI Village. SOCIAL: Some time was spent at the Catholic Mission, MONOITU, talking with Father LEBEL. Fr. LEBEL bitterly complained to me about talking with Father LEBEL Fr. LEBEL bitterly complained to me about the lack of liason with the missions by the Government, and about the existing mail services in the Siwai. The mail system appears to be run as efficiently as is possible in the Siwai, when the mail is brought up from Buin it is distributed through the Council; and it would appear that Fr. LEBEL wishes a car to call at his mission every mail day to take his mail down. This was pointed out as being impracticable, also there seems to be little co-operation between the United Church and the Catholic Church in the Siwai, as even the United Church and the Catholic Church in the Siwai, as even while the Patrol was at MONOITU, the United Church Land rover went past on its way down to BUIN, without stopping to inquire for mail.

Fr. Lebel did say he was impressed with the attitude of Mr. WEBB during his recent wight and had a long talk with both him and Mr. KUP his recent visit, and had had a long takk with both him and Mr KUP. In condusion, it would appear that

#### BUIN PATROL REPORT NO. 3 OF 1968/69 -C. TABUA. PATROL OFFICER.

Attached please find original and one copy of the abovementioned patrol report. This patrol was a follow up to Mr. Tabua's earlier patrol to this area (Buin Patrol Report No. 1 of 1968/69).

- 2. Under Mr. Tabua's supervision the people of the bush Kono area have made a start on the proposed strip near Oria Willage. A commercial Cessna strip (2000' x 200') has been marked out and good progress, felling of timber on the runway and approaches, has been made to date.
- 3. Mr. Balfour-Ogilvy will be relieving Mr. Tabua at Oria for a month, and in the meantime the people have taken a fortnight off from working on the strip to attend to the present cocca flush in that area. Next stage in the project is the removal of logs and stumps from the runway. The people have been issued with tools by the Administration for this purpose, and later on we hope to get a tractor and terracer blade to the site to assist with runway formation.
- 4. Co-operation to date between the Administration and Kono people has been excellent and hopes for the successful completion of the project, which will completely transform the economic life of these people, is high. Publicity on Radio Bougainville would be appreciated.
- 5. The assistance of the P.I.R. on this project for six days was appreciated by the people and very good relations were established between the Army and the people. Is the Police Commissioner aware of the fact that the Army is enhancing its image by civic action patrolling, while the police who once used to do this sort of work have lost status at the village level by holding themselves aloof from this kind of activity?
- 6. Mr. Tabua's claim for Camping Allowance attached for signature, please.

#### IMPROVEMENTS ON THE AIRSTRIP SITE:-

The fact that Officers of this Department and the policeman will be spending much of their time in future at ORIA Village, supervising the work on the proposed airstrip site, the patrol, during its first couple of days at ORIA Village, established a permanent camp site. This included repairing a rest house and building a new house for the policemen and toilet blocks etc..

During the period the patrol stayed at ORIA Village, the people have put in a great deal of effort in the work on the airstrip site. Both the primary and secondary growth on the airstrip site have been cleared, and the suitable terrain for a strip site was marked out with a centre line of 2000 feet long, and 100 feet were measured off on the opposite sides from the centre line. Work on the clearing of the vegetation on the

approach has begun, however, it is hoped to be finished when another Patrol Officer, Mr. H. B. Ogilvy, goes up to the area to continue with the work on the project in about a weeks time.

It is hoped that when the work on the clearing of the vegetation, and the removal of stumps, etc., on the strip site is completed, a tractor will be sent up to the area to assist the people in grading and levelling the surface of the strip.

The work force on the project ranged between 50 and 70 any one day. There are still a few men from villages, men at any one day. original, SULEKUNU and UBABAKOGU who have not been turning up for work on the airstrip site mear ORIA Willage. However, the importance of a Category "C" airstrip site near ORIA Village has been mentioned to the people, and all are aware of it. The Civil Action Patrol by the Pacific Island Regiment also assisted in the project when they patrolled through the area. assisted in the project when they patrolled through the area.



#### BUIN PATROL REPORT NO. A OF 1968/69: H. L. BALFOUR-OGILNY, PATROL OFFICER.

Attached please find original and two copies of the abovementioned report. The purpose of Mr. Balfour-Ogilvy's patrol to the upper Kano Census Division was to carry out supervisory duties at Oria, where an airctrip is being built with Administration assistance under the Rural Development Schame.

- 2. Good progress continues to be made on this project.

  Latest reports from Oria indicate that all stumps have now been cleared from the runway area. The next step, and the one which will take the most time and effort, is runway formation and earthworks. The Oria people have already been supplied by the Administration with sufficient tools to enable them to earry out these works.
- 3. In addition, a Ferguson tractor with earthmoving attachmats (plough and terracer blade) is available at Buin for use at Oria to speed up formation of the runsay and surface movement areas. It was originally proposed to carry this equipment from the road terminus at Talveo, to Oria, and the Oria people have agreed to do this.
- 4. However, when the C.R.A. Area Menager, Mr. Bishop, visited Buin recently, I asked him if the company would be prepared to assist the Oria people by making available a helicopter to airlift the tractor and attachments, plus fuel, from Tabago to Oria. Mr. Bishop held out some hopes of this possibility but said that he wanted to confer with yourself before making a final commitment.
- 5. Can you please advise me if this interview has taken place, and if so what was decided ?

#### BUIN PATROL NUMBER 4 OF 1968/69

#### INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this patrol was to continue supervision of the work on construction of the Oria airstrip. This strip was commenced by the people of the Oria area under the supervision of Patrol Officer C. J. Tabua (refer Buin Patrol 3 of 1968/69).

This report is of necessity only a short one covering Stage Two of construction, which enteiled the removal of log stumps and other vegetation on the runway.

#### PATROL DIARY

The Fatrol moved to Oria village on the 26/5/69 and returned on the 18/6/69 - diary as per Folios 146 - 169 of the patrolling officer's Field Officer's Journal.

#### AIRSTRIP .

At the time of arrival of the patrol, the airstrip had been reaghly cleared of light vegetation and timber. Large stumps towards the bottom end had also been removed.

During the period 26/5/69 to 18/6/69 considerable progress was made. The runway was cleared 200' for a length of 1000'. All stumps were removed and the area was ready for earthworks. However, it was decided to clean the full 2000' and then commence earthworks.

Recent verbal reports on the airstrip indicate that it is now ready for levelling and forming.

In general, the attitude to this project by the people of this area has been enthusiasm and the work has proceeded well to date.

#### CONCLUSION

In conclusion, it must be said that the Councillor from PAGUI Village, KORIBAI, has been the motivating force behind the village people who are engaged in the construction of the airstrip, and without his enthusiasm it is doubtful whether this project would have reached the stage that it is now at.

The proposal of putting a tractor and terracer blade up on the airstrip site, by the Administration, has given them the incentive to proceed with the third, and most difficult stage of construction of the airstrip which entails levelling to forming the runway.
