

"The Caretaker" will preview at UCSD

The Old Globe Arena production of Harold Pinter's controversial drama "The Caretaker" will preview for two nights at the San Diego campus of the University of California before opening in the old Globe's Falstaff Tavern on Friday, February 4.

The play, directed by Craig Noel, will be presented at 8.00 p.m. Wednesday and Thursday, February 2 and 3, in the 200-seat Humanities-Library Auditorium in Revelle College on the UCSD campus. Unreserved seating is \$2.50 for general admission and \$1. 00 for UCSD Students.

Tickets may be purchased through the UCSD Committee for Arts and Lectures in room 7209, Building B, on the campus or by mail to Arts and Lectures, Box 109 La Jolla.

The play, which deals with the suspicions of an elderly bum who is befriended and offered shelter by two brothers, has only three characters. They are played by Sandy Engel, who is making his first appearance with the Old Globe Theater; Michael Cheal, who has appeared with the National Shakespeare Festival at the Old Globe; and Richard Curtis, a native of Los Angeles who moved to San Diego in 1961.
