CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I The Lesbian and Gay Organization

ARTICLE II The purpose of this organization shall be to provide intellectual, social and emotional support for lesbian and gay students. In addition, meetings and activities will be educational and informative inviting the entire campus to learn and grow with us.

ARTICLE III The officers of the organization shall consist of four equal positions.

ARTICLE IV The group through concensus will suggest and appoint four officers with equal status and position.

ARTICLE V No dues are required of the members.

ARTICLE VI The organization shall meet at least twice a month during regular academic quarters.

ARTICLE VII Voting, both for officers and for expense approvals, is restricted to undergraduate students at UCSD.

ARTICLE VIII Other Articles may be added as needed.

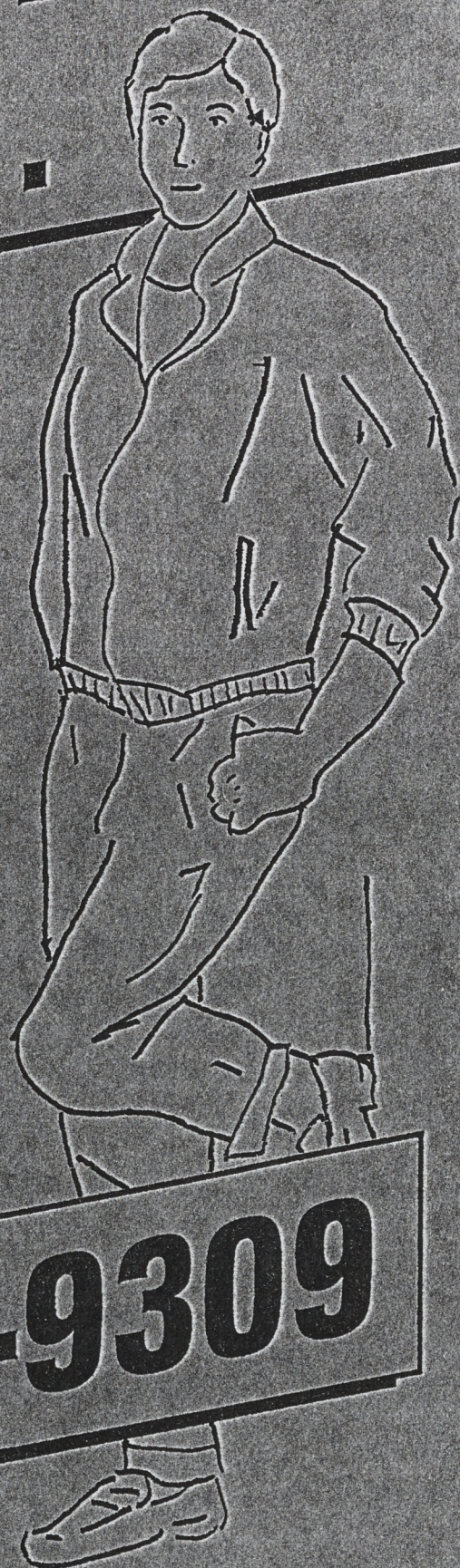

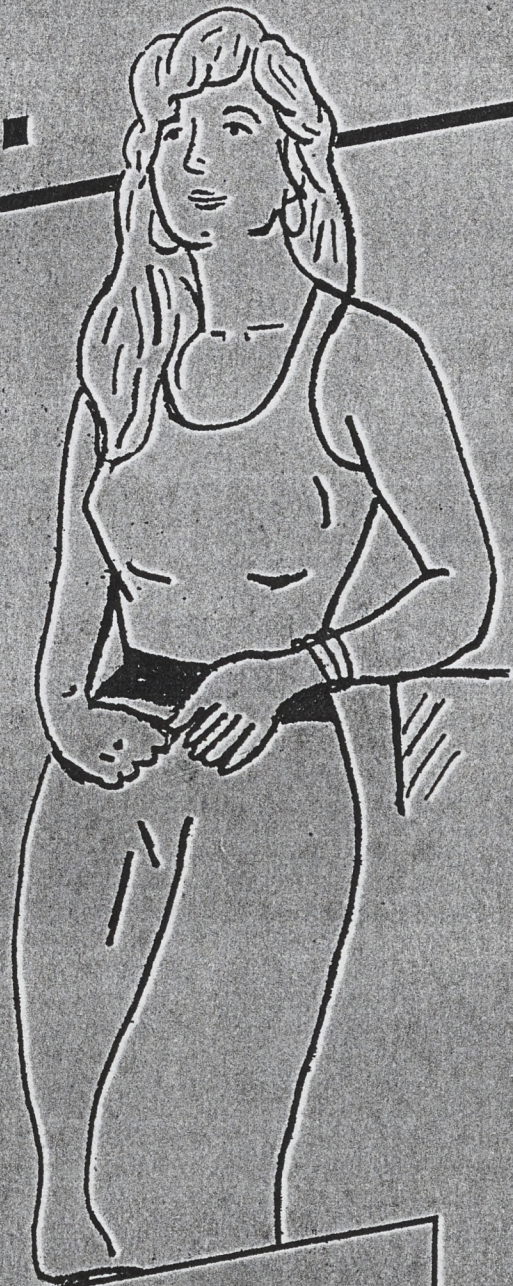

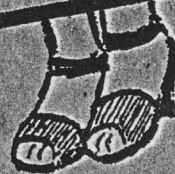

ACLU GAY RIGHTS CHAPTER



WHEN YOU MEET A GAY WOMAN; 16 TIPS FOR THE HETEROSEXUAL FEMALE

- 1) Do not run screaming from the room. This is rude
- 2) Do not say "Some of my best friends are that way"; this is trite.
- 3) If you must back away, do so slowly, and consider the effect.
- 4) Do not assume her knowledge of female sexuality is greater than your's. Do not assume it is not.
- 5) Do not assume sexual orientation is relevant to your friendship. Do not assume it is not.
- 6) Do not assume she is attracted to you.
- 7) Do not assume you are not attracted to her.
- 8) Do not expect her to be as excited about meeting a heterosexual as you are at meeting a lesbian. She was probably raised with them.
- 9) Do not immediately start talking about your husband or boyfriend in order to make it clear you are not gay. She probably already knows.
- 10) Do not ask her how she got THAT way. Instead, ask yourself!
- 11) Do not assume she is dying to talk about being a lesbian.
- 12) Do not expect her to refrain from talking about being a lesbian.
- 13) Do not trivialize her experience by assuming it is a bedroom issue only. She is herself twenty-four hours a day.
- 14) Do not assume that because she is a lesbian she wants to be treated like a man.
- 15) Do not assume that her heart will leap with joy if you touch her arm, (con-
descendingly?....flirtatiously?....power-testingly?...) It makes her angry.
- 16) If you are tempted to tell her she is limiting her experience, THINK ABOUT IT!

WHEN YOU MEET A GAY MAN; 16 TIPS FOR THE HETEROSEXUAL MALE

- 1) Resist the temptation to hit him in the mouth. This is rude.
- 2) Do not say "Some of my best friends are that way"; this is trite.
- 3) Do not assume he is sexually attracted to you. Do not assume he is not.
- 4) Do not assume you are sexually superior to him. He has probably tried it both ways.
- 5) Do not assume sexual orientation is relevant to your friendship. Do not assume it is not!
- 6) Do not assume he is attracted to you.
- 7) Do not assume you are not attracted to him.
- 8) Do not talk about your sexual conquests of women, if you are not gay, he probably already knows it.
- 9) Do not ask him how he got THAT way. Instead, ask yourself.
- 10) Do not expect him to be as excited about meeting a heterosexual as you are about meeting a gay man. He was probably raised with them.
- 11) Do not assume he is dying to talk about being gay.
- 12) Do not expect him to refrain from talking about being gay.
- 13) Do not assume that because he is gay, he is less of a man than you are. As a matter of fact do not judge him at all.
- 14) Do not trivialize his experience, by assuming it is a bedroom issue only. He is himself twenty-four hours a day.
- 15) Do not assume he will get a RUSH if you shake his hand. It probably did not mean THAT much to him.
- 16) If you are tempted to tell him he is limiting his experience, THINK ABOUT IT!

Twelve Suggestions for heterosexual men who want to know how they can support the women's movement

1. **Burn all your pornography.**
2. **Insist that all your friends burn all their pornography.**
3. **Walk into a liquor store and destroy every Hustler magazine on the stands. Take one militant action against pornography every day.**
4. **Burn the pornographic images of women out of your mind. Make that a top priority in your life.**
5. **Never ask "Did you come?" Understand that her clitoris is equivalent to your penis and give it as much attention. You won't need to ask.**
6. **Always carry rubbers. Use them without being asked.**
7. **Castrate yourself mentally. Get over that phobia. Understand that you fear not losing flesh, but power. Give up that power. Destroy the idea of your penis as a weapon, as an instrument of conquering, as a battering ram. Replace it with the idea of your penis as a soft and delicate part of your body that can be used to gently stroke a woman inside. Make love for an hour without once thinking about your penis. Go through a day without once thinking about your penis. Pee sitting down.**
8. **Think of a woman's vagina as her home. Never enter unless you are given a warm and enthusiastic invitation. Always wash and put on your hat before you enter. Remember that you are a guest. If you don't know the rules of the house, wait to be shown or ask. Don't get rowdy and bump into things. You may not be invited back. And remember that the best entertaining happens on her front porch.**
9. **Spend an hour every day taking responsibility for the child of a single mother. Spend the hour doing what the child wants to do.**
10. **Learn to see dirt. Learn to hate dirt. Learn to remove dirt.**
11. **Interrupt every sexist comment that you hear by saying that it makes you angry or hurts you, and then explain why.**
12. **When men call you a fag for doing these things, answer that yes, you are one.**

Start out by doing these things, then meet every week with a group of men and make your own list.
