

## Summer session to offer variety of courses

## June 7, 1978

For the first time summer session at the University of California, San Diego will come in two sizes--a three-week version and a six-week version.

The three-week session is scheduled to last from June 26 until July 14 and the longer, six-week, session from July 17 to August 25.

The UC San Diego Summer Session office advises that applicants should register in Advance by mail. A catalog listing dates, courses, admission requirements and all other pertinent information can be obtained by writing to: Summer Session Office, Q-028, University of California, San Diego, La Jolla, CA, 92093, (714) 452-4364.

Summer Session courses are open to all students who are regularly enrolled at any University of California campus. According to the catalog, individuals who have never attended the University of California may also enroll in summer session if they are high school graduates, "or are 18 years of age or older, and have the maturity and aptitude for the level of study desired."

Admission to summer session, however, does not constitute regular admission to the University of California, nor does it mean that the student is necessarily eligible for admission to the University.

Both summer sessions will offer a wide ranging array of courses from which to choose. Among those offered during the first session are: "Bhuddism and Society" (Anthropology 120), "Environment and History" (History 31S), "The Presidency" (Political Science 109), and "Sociology of the Occult" (Sociology 193).

The second session will feature such courses as "Introduction to Computer Science" (APIS 61), "Genetics" (Biology 101), "Organic Chemistry" (Chemistry 140), "Victorian Society and Culture" (History 117S), "Philosophy of Language" (Philosophy 130A), "Basic Statistics" (Mathematics 80A), and "American Criminal Justice" (Urban and Rural Studies 161).
