

Cinco de Mayo will be celebrated on May 5 with a multicultural program

Cinco de Mayo, the Mexican national holiday, will be celebrated at the University of California, San Diego Monday, May 5, with a multicultural program held outdoors on the Third College Plaza of the Matthews campus.

Festivities, which begin at 11 a.m. and continue to about 3 p.m., will include entertainment, speeches and a Mexican meal.

Entertainment will include mariachi music, skits, singing and dancing. In addition to performances by Chicano groups, there will be presentations by Tahitian, Japanese, Hawaiian, Polynesian, Israeli, Greek, Black and native American groups.

Most of the individuals and groups performing will be UCSD students.

The Chicanas, a UCSD Chicano women's group, will serve a home-cooked Mexican meal of burritos, refried beans and rice starting at noon.

The entertainment is free and open to the public. A \$.75 charge will be made for the Mexican lunch.

The celebration is sponsored by the UCSD chapter of M.E.C.H.A., a movement of Chicano students in North America.
