

Yfrah Neaman presents two recitals-- Sunday, May 19 and Tuesday, May 21, at Sumner Auditorium, 8:00 p.m.

Johann Sebastian Bach's six sonatas and partitas for unaccompanied violin will be played by the English violinist, Yfrah Neaman, in two recitals at the University of California's San Diego campus, Sunday, May 19, and Tuesday, May 21.

Admission is free to both programs, which will be held in UCSD's Sumner Auditorium at 8:00 p.m. The public is welcome.

Sunday's recital will include "Sonata No. 1 in G minor," "Partita No. 1 in B minor and "Sonata No. 3 in C major."

On Tuesday, Mr. Neaman will play "Partita No. 3 in E major, "Sonata No. 2 in A minor and "Partita No. 2 in D minor."

Called "extraordinarily masterful" by the London Times and a "supreme technician" by the Washington Star, Mr. Neaman has played extensively at home and abroad.

He studied under Max Rostal, and succeeded Mr. Rostal as professor of violin at the Guildhall School of Music, London. He has played more than 15 times at the London National Gallery concerts.
