UCSD TO SPONSOR PANEL ON RELATIONS BETWEEN BLACKS AND JEWS

UCSD'S Third College will sponsor a public lecture on relations between Blacks and Jews on Monday, February 12, at 7:00 p.m., in the Price Center Ballroom. The lecture is being held in celebration of Third College's 20th anniversary year.

"The Relationship of Blacks and Jews Since the Civil Rights Movement" is the first event in the Third College Convocation Series, and will feature a panel of some of the nation's top writers and commentators on ethnic issues.

The panel speakers will include Taylor Branch, author of the 1989 Pulitzer prize-winning book "Parting the Waters: America in the King Years, 1954-63"; Juan Williams, a reporter for the Washington Post and the producer of the acclaimed 1988 television documentary, "Eyes on the Prize"; and Leonard Fein, who has written widely on issues relating to American Jewish attitudes and is the author of the recent book "Where Are We Now: The Inner Life of America's Jews."

"In anticipation of its 20th anniversary celebration in 1990-91, I am pleased to announce the inauguration of the Third College Convocation Series with this significant event," said Cecil Lytle, provost of Third College. "We have a very impressive panel representing some of the most insightful and intelligent thinking in the country on Blacks and Jews and the relationship between the two groups over the last 20 years."
