Occeased friend, I must request that you'l give directions for such a Tomb Stone to be made, as you'l judge proper for him, and have whatever Inscription made thereon as you'l think fit, and oue to the Memory of so worthy and good a man and let it be vent out here as soon as profesible, whatever the Depence amounts to I shall desire ON. O Mure imidiately to discharge it as I purpose writing to him on the Occasion

Will, and have expressed themselves in such Digh Verms of Resentment both to me ON! Stone and several others that I think it greatly to their Discussit; they have taken away their Daughter from eN! Stone's Care, however I hope they will soon think better and cool upon the Matter.

As I hope you will undertake the trouble of getting the Tomb Stone for Colonel Barclay, I request you't likewise Oblige me in bespeaking one from the vame hand to be put overmy little Girl Bonnella Stone who dry the Day of January 1763 aged and vend both by the Vame Ship, and I hall write to N. o Hure to pay the Expence of that and Col. Barely together.
