BACKGROUND: The Center for U.S.-Mexican Studies at UCSD has received new grants totaling more than \$1 million for its research, publications, student training and public service activities during the 1984-1987 period.

The grants, in varying amounts, have been given by four major foundations including the largest grant ever made to UCSD by the Ford Foundation. Representatives of the foundations, a prominent member of the San Diego business community and the Center's staff will be present to answer questions.

According to Center director Dr. Wayne A. Cornelius, the award of these grants marks the most important event in the Center's history. Several new projects for the 1984-87 period which will involve the San Diego/Tijuana community will be announced.
