

Public Lecture by E. W. Fager on "Ecology of Communities

January 11, 1963

What happens when man disrupts the animal community will be discussed by the Chairman of the University of California's Department of Oceanography in a free public lecture in La Jolla, Tuesday night, January 15.

"The Ecology of Communities" is the title of the talk which will be given by Prof. E.W. Pagers Associate Professor of Biology in a Faculty Lecture at Sherwood Hall, Art Center in La Jolla at 8:00 p.m.

Co-sponsored by the University's San Diego campus and the Theatre and Arts Foundation of San Diego County, the event is open to the public. Admission is free.

Dr. Pager's special field of study is population dynamics, and his talk will deal with populations in nature. Born in California, he received a Ph.D. in organic chemistry from Yale, and a D. Phil. in zoology from Oxford. He came to the Scripps Institution of Oceanography in 1956.
