## POINTS OF INTEREST

### IN THE CITY

**BALBOA PARK:** San Diego's 1400-acre cultural center, site of the Summer Festival, San Diego Zoo, art galleries, museums and gardens, located in the heart of the city.

**BALBOA PARK MINIATURE RAILWAY:** A fun ride for children 6 to 60. Located at the entrance to the San Diego Zoo. Open daily 10-6.

**BELMONT AMUSEMENT PARK:** Miniature Golf, Kiddieland, 16 major rides, picnic area, Roller Coaster, Boats; Mission Beach, afternoon and evening.

**CABRILLO NATIONAL MONUMENT:** Commemorates the discovery of the California coast by Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo in 1542. The "Old Spanish Lighthouse" and magnificent marine view from its location on Point Loma attracts more visitors than the Statue of Liberty. Open daily 9-5:30.

**EMBARCADERO:** San Diego's colorful waterfront, lined with ships of all types, just a walk from downtown.

**LA JOLLA:** "The Jewel," a charming residential area by the ocean, with the La Jolla Cove, ocean caves, and hours of fascinating shopping.

**MISSION BAY PARK:** San Diego's 30 million dollar aquatic playland with 4,500 acres of water fun, located just a few minutes from downtown.

**MISSION SAN DIEGO de ALCALA:** First of the California missions, built by Father Junipero Serra in 1769 in what is now Presidio Park, and moved to its present location on Friars Road, Mission Valley, six years later. Open daily 9-5.

**OLD SAN DIEGO:** A living museum within the city, where civilization first settled in California. The plaza and many original adobes have been restored.

**SAN DIEGO ZOO & CHILDREN'S ZOO:** The world's largest collection of wild animals on outdoor display all year. Open 9-6.

## POINTS OF INTEREST

### IN THE COUNTY

San Diego County combines mountains, desert and beaches in an area stretching 65 miles from Mexico north along the Pacific and 80 miles east in altitudes ranging from sea level to 6,500 feet. The Laguna Mountain Recreation area and the Cuyamaca Rancho State Park are intersected by Highways 80, 78 and 79. The Anza Desert State Park is crossed by Highway 78.

**BORREGO SPRINGS:** A desert resort located in the Anza Desert, 90 mi. east of San Diego off Hwy. 78.

**CORONADO:** A beautiful resort community located just across the Bay from San Diego and easily accessible by ferry, famous for its historical resort hotel, a beautiful boat harbor, Glorietta Bay, and many fine beach areas.

**JULIAN:** Old mining town with false front stores and abandoned mines, located 60 miles northeast of San Diego on Highway 78.

**MISSION SAN LUIS REY:** The only mission still administered by the Franciscan founders, located east of Oceanside on Highway 76.

**MOUNT HELIX:** Affords a view of valleys, mountains and ocean, located near Grossmont off U. S. 80.

**PALA ASISTENCIA MISSION:** The only California mission still used as a place of worship by the Indians, located on Highway 76 near Mt. Palomar.

**PALOMAR OBSERVATORY:** World's largest telescope, up the "Highway to the Stars" to the 6,000-foot summit of Mt. Palomar, off Highway 76. Open 9:30-4:30.

**SUNRISE DRIVE:** Drive along the ridge of the Laguna Mountains where you will see spectacular views of the desert and Salton Sea more than 5,000 feet below, off Hwys. 79 & 80.

**VALLECITO DESERT & BUTTERFIELD STAGE STATION:** History and desert scenery located south of Highway 78 about five miles east of Banner.

## FUN IN EVERY SEASON

**MODEL YACHT REGATTA:** The biggest event of its kind in the nation, the 32nd annual model yacht regatta is scheduled for June 6 in the Model Yacht Basin in the heart of Mission Bay Aquatic Park. Approximately 1100 youngsters will vie for honors with their hand-built model windjammers.

**OLD SAN DIEGO ART FIESTA:** San Diego's professional artists display their work in the historic Spanish Plaza of Old San Diego on June 13-14. Spanish att'ed women are official hostesses for this 6th annual event.

**SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EXPOSITION AND SAN DIEGO COUNTY FAIR:** The scene of this event is the impressive Del Mar Fair Grounds located just 20 miles north of the city. The gates open June 26 and the following 10 days are packed with an exciting schedule. More than 265 acres are devoted to exhibits including a multi-million dollar display of flowers and gardens, world's largest national horse show, art exhibit, international photo salon, world's largest Indian museum, livestock, hobby show, minerals and gems, stamp and coin show, tropical fish, agricultural products, commerce and industry and complete junior fair. Continuous entertainment and free grandstand shows at 2:30 and 6:30, which feature famous personalities, will be included in the Fair activities.

**SUMMER FESTIVAL:** San Diego's famous Balboa Park is the scene of the annual Summer Festival. The 1400 acre park is located in the heart of the city and is the center of cultural activities. Every year the Summer Festival offers Star-Light Opera, an outdoor series of Broadway musicals in the Balboa Bowl from July to Sept.; Symphony under the stars, a series of concerts on seven consecutive Tuesdays starting July 14 and featuring noted guest artists and conductors; Old Globe Theatre's National Shakespeare Festival which will present "Romeo & Juliet," "Loves Labour Lost," and "Henry IV, Part I" alternating nightly from July 7 thru August 30. The Old Globe Theatre is an exact replica of the original London Theatre and each performance in the Shakespeare Festival is preceded by Elizabethan "Pageant on the Green" in front of the Theatre. During the Summer Festival there is also the attraction of San Diego's famous Zoo and many special features in the exhibit areas of the park.

**LA JOLLA PLAYHOUSE:** With all the dash, color and vitality that characterizes Hollywood, the star-studded La Jolla Playhouse will present a series of five plays during their 13th season of professional summer theatre, June 29 to September 5.

**BORREGO SPRINGS SUN WORSHIPPERS FIESTA:** Summer-time madness comes to this desert resort July 11 when the community celebrates with a parade of zany floats and other amusing activities.

**DEL MAR THOROUGHBRED RACING:** Seaside Track built and made famous by Bing Crosby and Pat O'Brien will open its 20th season July 24 and will run through Sept. 12. This famous track aptly tagged "Where the Turf Meets the Surf," "Vacationland of the Racing Fan," "Where no one hurries but the horses," is a mecca for countless celebrities of stage, screen and television.
