

The Beaux Arts Trio to perform

February 25, 1982

The Beaux Arts Trio, one of the highest acclaimed piano trios in the world, will perform at 8 p.m. Saturday, March 13, in the Mandeville Center Auditorium at the University of California, San Diego.

The group has had season after season of sold out tours in the United States and Europe. The trio has won a host of international awards, including the Grand Prix du Disque, the Deutscher Schallplattenpreis, the Grand Prix National du Disque, the Union de la Presse Musical Belge and the Gramophone Record of the Year.

The Beaux Arts Trio is composed of pianist Menachen Pressler, violinist Isidore Cohen and cellist Bernard Greenhouse.

Pressler is an Israeli-American who was born in Germany but fled to Israel when Hitler came to power. He has performed with the Philadelphia Orchestra, the New York Philharmonic and the Cleveland Orchestra.

Cohen was born in New York City and studied at Juilliard. He is concertmaster of the Little Orchestra Society in New York, and has held the post with many other orchestras. Cohen has an extensive chamber music background which includes being a member of the Juilliard String Quartet.

Greenhouse, a fellowship student at Juilliard, also studied under master cellist Pablo Casals for two years. While working as a professor of music at a New York university, he has made appearances with many orchestras and chamber groups in most of the major cities of Europe and the U.S.

The Beaux Arts Trio was formed in 1955. "An inspiring experience," was the late Arturo Toscanini's verdict after hearing the trio play, "fine chamber music with impeccable taste and musicianship."
