- 18/9 cont 8.15am Parade at Sub-District Office for Police and other government workers.  
 10.30 Proceeded for Supi, on patrol, a companyed by S/C Kombok Gundu, Constable/1 Corp. and Interpreter Pilsi Lero, arrived at 11.30am.  
 11.45 to 12.30 prepared Civil House King as base camp for the patrol duration.  
 1.00 3.00pm. Explain to some of the elders of Supi the purpose of the patrol. I learnt that the dispute was between sub-clan NIFI of Agville clan and NIFI of Musbu clan.
- 19/9 8.00am proceeded to carryout the investigation on the dispute. I called off the investigation after Musbu clan failed to turn up. Went to their village and found out that one of their members had died. Returned to the Post house 2.30pm  
 3.00pm to 4.30pm Meeting with councillor Sunik and Village Committee at the Post House.
- 20/9 8.00am proceeded to Tagulipa to carryout the investigation.  
 8.30am arrived at Tagulipa and commence the investigation.  
 9.30 am conversed (I.HUGHES) the people on the policemen. Hugh stated to me that Mr Hughes marked out that piece of land I was surveying as the boundary for the Yohn clan. Heavy rain forced me to abandon the survey and return to the post house at 4.30pm.
- 21/9 6.00am proceeded to Yohnia after Agville clan complained that the Musbus were clearing a track to indicate their boundary at Iengwana. Continuous shooting could be heard from the post house, which is about a quarter of a mile away. 6.15am arrived at Yohnia and ordered Musbu clan to go to Tagulipa while I talk to Musbu people. 10.50 proceeded to Tagulipa and commenced surveying, completed the survey at 3.30pm.

We were intercepted by group of people led by Piaipiri of Kelyan, a subclan of Aruila. Piaipiri protested strongly on the behalf of his followers of about 20 men. He claimed that land the Mambu's placed their eastern border on which is on the River Tissi, belonged to KAZYA, MUSANDA, KOK and KAMBEROF, three of which are subclans of Aruila and that they have nothing to do with the dispute which was between Kazi, another subclan of Aruila, and Mambu subclan Kurepe. I explained the aims of the survey party from 1.00 to 3.00pm, when heavy rain forced us to retreat back to the base camp, but still Piaipiri was not yet convinced because he I think he shift his mind completely from my explanations. Arrived at Base Camp 4.15pm
2/10		8.00am proceeded to River Tissi to survey the mark which the Mambu had already cleared. 8.00am the investigation party was intercepted the Mambu clan near Papalina. I learnt from them that Piaipiri and his followers had

- 2/10 cont. Surveyed the main road about half way between Pagulpa and River Nini. I instructed all the Nambu people not to follow my party and myself except such the Nambu eight elders were allowed to come with me. That Plapiri was accompanied by 18 other people. After very lengthy discussion I managed to convince Plapiri and his followers about their rights to voice rights in Court. 10.30am commenced surveying the land, completed at 3.00 pm.
- 3/10/13 8.00 am started on getting depositions with the Agwila clan. First of the six from Agwila. TRACI/TANAPI from 8.00am to 12 noon. Resumed at 1.00pm to 3.00pm. Started with SINI/API from 3.00 till afternoon at 6.30pm.
- 4/10 Resumed with Giri And - completed at 4.30pm.
- 5/10 Started on SU/AGWILY at 8.00 till 4.30pm.
- 6/10 8.00am started on YILAY/YANGILI till 12 noon, and resumed at 1.00 till 4.30pm.
- 7/10 8.30am started with PIRIV/AUPE. Completed at 4.00pm.
- 8/10 8.30am TRACI/TANAPI - finished at 3.30pm. Called back all Agwila depositors to take down their genealogy - completed at 7.30pm.
- 9/10 Started with the Nambu clan at 8.00am with MATA/ITAPALY till 4.00 pm.
- 10/10 8.00am with DAPI/MENO - completed at 4.30pm.
- 11/10 8.30am, started with HEP/WAPENE till 10.30, Resumed at 1.30 till 4.30pm.

- : 15/10/73      8.00am started to get deposition with HES/NGKE of Mambu clan. Finished at 12 noon. 12 to 1.00pm lunch break.  
 1.00pm called all Mambu depositors to take down their genealogy. Got only genealogy of sub-clans Lc and Ipikeyna. I tried two times to get the genealogy of sub-clan Korape but would not go any further because the informant AENE/LEWARI and EUNYONE did not seem to know their Korape genealogy. But finally they settled on something on which I got down the next day.  
 4.00pm I took six men from each line who gave me the depositions to YAMAMANI, PAGULIPA and LUSIPAK to count the house and the population of the three land mentioned. Returned to the Base Camp at 7.00 pm.
- 16/10      9.00am PUE/NORE and AYES/LEWARI tried again on the Korape genealogy till 12 noon. Meditated a case with a married couple at 1.30 till 4.00pm.
- 17.10      8.00 to 9.00am took down land/boundary groups adjacent to or near Papuan.  
 9.00am End of Patrol returned to Kandip, arrived at 10.15am.  
 10.15am started writing my patrol report till 4.00pm.

Introduction.

The patrol was part of A.D.O. Robson's patrol of the area. I accompanied it for 3 days to familiarise myself with the area and the people, and to look at proposed R.I.P. projects.

Jumbis Road.

This is a reasonable proposition, but will entail much hard work, particularly the Wape river crossing which will require a causeway. The people are willing to work, but expressed the desire to see meaningful development follow.

The much talked of route into the Lagaip from the Wape was walked. I regard the proposal as impractical at present, but if the people from Turbis, Petendak, Karokore and Kindrep were to join together they could put in this road if they were prepared to spend about 5 years at it. The country is high altitude swamp, but easily drainable, and there are numerous basins that would be excellent for potato production.

I would recommend this as an R.I.P. proposal at this stage.

The patrol was conducted in part of the mountain section of the Lai Arsent Census Division, and consisted of two periods camped out, in March and June, plus 23 field days in the intervening period. Original instructions were issued by Mr Heretton, and on his arrival Mr Roberts issued supplementary instructions.

Aim of the patrol were purchase of a Rural Police Post site in the Tinjipak area, S. 75° bearing of a land dispute near Tinjipak (both on the north side of the Lai Arsent River, and on the south side, upgrading of the mountain section of the Lai Arsent to road.

With the arrival of large amounts of additional funds, including \$2,500 of Southern Highlands R.I.P. and labour intensive zones, the patrol was forced to concentrate on the Nandi road. As to Tinjipak R.I.P., a site was selected in the rest house area. This was later ~~proposed~~ investigated by Mr Roberts - unfortunately the better hill land adjacent to the Catholic church could not be obtained because of the reluctance of the owners to sell, but the level area on both sides of the road near the rest house is expected to be satisfactory when properly drained.

The Tinjipak land dispute hearing was begun, and depositions from the Ngap clan witnesses were taken. The area is quiet and the hearing will be completed as soon as another officer is available to take over the Nandi road.

The Nandi road is about 35 miles ~~long~~ long, 'about' because there are three routes on the Nandi side, all roughly of the same length. The road falls into three sections: from Sandep to the foot of the dividing range the road is in good condition, and though badly surfaced in parts it has been ignored, except for the replacement of a few bridges and culverts; the corresponding valley section from Sandi to the divide is quite drivable, but suffers from a total lack of the regular maintenance usual in Samiap, and so is overgrown and has many bridges and culverts in poor condition - however, Sami council has built a long new bench in the Pumbi arm of even grade, cutting out a steep winding section of the existing road, and when this is opened to traffic after surfacing, it will reduce driving time considerably.

The third section and by far the most difficult is the Sandi-Nandi divide, eight miles long, consisting of a three mile climb from Sandi, Samiap's last village, and then a descent of five miles to Ngil, the first Nandi village. In the past the road has been very dangerous and often impassable due to certain sections on the Nandi side. Difficulties include sustained steep grades on both sides, complete absence of true stone above the valley floors, and unstable land leading to frequent slides even in old settled road sections. In new work the problem is aggravated, and over a recent long weekend there were sixteen slides in the new work.

In this section work supervised by Nandi officers consisted of 1½ miles of new bench from Ngil upwards, and some additional landslip clearing. Under Narop supervision and using Sandep labour but Nandi funds, the narrow and dangerous sections on the Nandi side were repaired, and several short steep pinches regraded. On Sandep side and with Nandi funds several spots were upgraded. Thereafter work has concentrated on surfacing, using a stone crusher hired from Sami L.G.C. Originally it was planned

to start surfacing on the watercap and move over towards Ingil, but due to unkind weather tractors started to damage the landing stage, and so work is now proceeding - away from Ingil. A very good surface is being produced, but slowly - the best that can be done is 150 feet per day given good weather, so that completion of the project is a year away even if there is continued availability of funds and stone crusher.

Various minor matters were brought to the patrol for arbitration, but the Local Court, apart from the 15a hearing, was only convened once. Nothing more regarding disputes the scope of the patrol instructions occurred.
