

John Strickland to speak on chemistry of seawater

The chemistry of seawater and its effect on ocean life will be discussed by Dr. John D. H. Strickland before the Vaughan Aquarium Volunteer Association Thursday, December 8, at 8:00 p.m. in Sumner Auditorium, on the campus of UCSD's Scripps Institution of Oceanography.

Dr. Strickland, a research oceanographer, heads the Institute of Marine Resources' Food-Chain Research Group at Scripps. He is a native of England and received his doctorate from the University of London. Prior to joining Scripps Institution in 1963, he held a research post with the Fisheries Research Board of Canada, at the Nanaimo British Columbia, Biological Station. He is co-author of a "Manual of Seawater Analysis, considered an authoritative text by seawater chemists.

Following the meeting, which is open to the public, Don Wilkie, aquarium will conduct an informal discussion of sharks and rays at the aquarium's Tank No. 1.
