Sir
Mr. Scott has already wrote you from
Kingston acknowledging the receipt of your esteemed
favours of the 15 March last covering your Power of Attorney
to him and me for the management of your affairs in this
Island, which power was immediately proved and recorded,
and you may rest fully satisfied that care in our part
shall be taken to carry on your Estates with frugality,
that a steady attention shall be given to your Interest in
generall on every occasion and that your instructions
from time to time shall be punctually complied with.
We are now upon terms with Mr. Hamilton's attorney
as to the sale of Lilly Bitch land and as soon as anything
conclusive takes place you shall be duly advised and
what ever part of your Father's personal Est: is received
this year shall be remitted to Mr. Kerr & Mr. Dehany
as you direct - Before Mr. Kerr's letter came to hand
ordering your Sugars to be Consigned to Messrs Serocold
& Jackson I had shipped 25 hhd on the Union Capt. W.
Hamilton to the address of Messrs Tuller, which I suppose
you can put to rights yourself, all the remainder that
goes to London shall be sent to Messrs Serocold & Co and
what goes to Bristol to Mr. Gordon as usual - The
Memorandums for the supplies for your Estates for
next season were sent to Mr. Kerr by the Hanover
Planter Capt. Lussan and the earlier they are all sent
out the better - I wrote Mr. Kerr very lately in what
forwardness we were in at the new Estate which he no
doubt has communicated to you they continue to good

briskly with the buildings and I can not think there
is any doubt of its turning out well. you shall have a
very particular account of it as soon as we make sugar
and likewise be advised from time to time what
progress they are making in the settlement -

Since my last advice to Mr Kerr I have shipped and
engaged to ship the following sugars on your acc^t -

35 lbs Musc^o sugar on the Windsor Capt Olive to Bristol
10 lbs Clay^d

15 lbs Musc^o on the Thats Capt May } to London
10 lbs do on the Echoe Capt Moncur }

all which I wish to a good market - Capt Magnets has
come out so late this season that I fear it will be in
our power to do but little for him, indeed that is the
reason that he has not had sugars for some years
past - as they have ^{been} generally all shipped and engaged
before he arrived. any instructions of this kind you
are pleased to give shall be paid proper respect to -

By the 25th inst^o I shall write you as nearly as I
can what this years Crop will be and how the rest
shall be shipped, the weather is at present so wet that
hardly any sugars can be carried down the roads and
is bad however the rain will be all in favour of the
next crop - By Capt Lamy of the Hanover Planter
Mr Scott and I sent you a fine Green Turtle of about
240 lbs which we hope will reach you safe and
by this opportunity of the Dawes Capt Brown I have
sent you a box containing 6 bottles of Pickled pepper
which I beg your acceptance of and you may depend
on something of this kind being sent you every

year when in season - I received your letter by the
Mulatto fellow Stephen, but I believe you must have
committed a mistake in the direction as its contents
could not be intended for me - I should be glad to
know your intentions as to Stephen as he formed great
expectations from your letter and was vastly disappointed
when I told him that it did not relate to him, he has
a house and home at Irwin Est^s for the present and
quite an idle man - I am with respect
