

Dr. Elliott Lasser is PILS lecturer

Dr. Elliott C. Lasser, professor and chairman in the Department of Radiology at the University of California, San Diego, School of Medicine, will deliver the first lecture for the Spring quarter in the Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series to be held at 4:15 p.m. on Thursday, April 3, in the Humanities-Library Auditorium, Revelle College.

Dr. Lasser's topic will be "Of lodine on Rings."

He joined the faculty at UCSD in July, 1968, coming to San Diego from University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. Before his position at Pittsburgh, Dr. Lasser served as, associate chief and, later, chief of diagnostic radiology at Roswell Park Memorial institute.

Dr. Lasser received a B. S. degree from Harvard University and an M.D. degree from the University of Buffalo Medical School. He served as an intern at the Buffalo General Hospital and was a resident in radiology at the University of Minnesota Hospitals.

His research at UCSD includes a study of the relationship between the molecular structure of the x-ray contrast media and the toxicity and tissue distributions of these substances.

He is a member of many organizations, including: the NIH-Radiation Study Section; American College of Radiology-Chairman, Committee on Drugs; Radiological Society of North America; American Association for the Advancement of Science; and American Medical Association.

The lecture, presented by the UCSD Committee for Arts and Lectures, is free and open to the public.
