Rainfall for storm the last 48 hours:

Cuyamaca Lake .48, Grossmont .13. Cuyamaca Water Co. flume at Diverting Dam running full and a considerable amount of water wasting over the Diverting Dam as well. La Mesa Lake, Murray Hill and Eucalyptus Reservoirs of the Cuyamaca Water Co. full to spillway. In Cuyamaca Lake approximately 21 ft. of water. No water has yet been drawn out of Cuyamaca Lake this season, and it is not expected that there will be any draft on Cuyamaca Lake until July 15th at least as the summer flow of the San Diego river below Cuyamaca Lake fed by springs has been and will continue to furnish all the requirements of the Cuyamaca System for nearly a month yet. The Cuyamaca Water Company have been furnishing the city of San Diego city with three million gallons daily until May 24th. The Company today again commenced supplying the city with water and will continue to do so until the stream flow is sufficient only to take care of the consumers of the Cuyamaca Water Co.

To Whom It May Concern:

Owing to the absence of our chief engineer, Mr Post, and owing to the urgency of the case, I wish to announce that from this day Mr Morse will have charge of the purchasing of the supplies of the different camps of the Volcan Land & Water Company and the Cuyamaca Water Company covering all new construction work. Mr Morse will keep in touch with the party in charge, find out the needs of each camp, and see that those needs are furnished.

All bills for supplies will be purchased in the name of the respective companies by Mr Morse and ok'd by him and turned into the office of our chief engineer, Mr Post. This refers to the supplies of the camps alone and in no way applies to the purchase of materials for new construction work, unless so ordered by Mr Post.

If Mr Morse does not keep in touch with the camps and see that the necessary supplies are furnished, I request a written complaint immediately thru Mr Post's office. Mr Morse will immediately get in touch with each camp and find out the supplies on hand and each month check up and make a report of stock on hand thru Mr Post's office.

This applies to the purchasing of supplies for the Volcan Land & Water Company and the Cuyamaca Water Co.

Gentlemen:

The enclosed letter is forwarded to you for
your information. This indicated uncertainty as to the
form of presenting accounts. These instructions are
issued to be effective from September 1st.

1. Superintendents of Construction will receive orders
from W. S. Post, Chief Engineer, transmit papers
to the Company through him and have complete
authority to hire and discharge men and do other
things necessary to carry out the work intrusted
to them, conformably to the rules of the Company.
2. They will make up payrolls for all men directly
hired by themselves on Cuyamaca Water Company
payrolls.
3. They will act as inspectors and approving officer
of the rented teams of the Morse Const. Co. and
will place their OK upon the daily reports of
this company, which will be the authority for
payment for rented teams.
4. They will act as inspectors and approving officer
of contracts on their work, such as Reinforced
Pipe Co., Hazard, Gould & Co., etc., placing upon
your weekly reports full data which may require
the attention of the accounting department.
Receipts will be secured for all material furnished
by the Company to contractors, daily if possible
and transmitted to this office along with weekly
reports.
5. Superintendents will transmit weekly reports to this
office weeks to begin Sunday morning and end Saturday
night; also the week at the end of any month shall
be divided so as to include only the last day of that
month. The monthly summaries shall be made up in
the Engineer's office.
These reports will contain:
(a) Jobs undertaken or in progress during the week.
(b) Number of men of each class on each job, Company's
force.

- (c) Company material used on each job.
 - (d) Total quantities in job completed in linear feet, or cubic yards, etc., at end of week.
 - (e) Similar report on any contractors jobs.
 - (f) Company labor or material furnished to contractors, receipts therefor attached and any necessary information for billing same.
6. Commissary - each superintendent of construction is in charge of the commissary and boarding-house at his camp and will keep accurate account of all board and commissary deductions and place same on his payroll as deductions in the usual manner. For all board and commissary accounts furnished to any contractor and make monthly bills for same. These bills shall be promptly forwarded to this office. He will also furnish the contractor current information regarding these charges as requested. Superintendent, when necessary, may employ a clerk ~~or~~ or timekeeper to assist him.
7. Requisitions for material have been provided for in previous instructions.

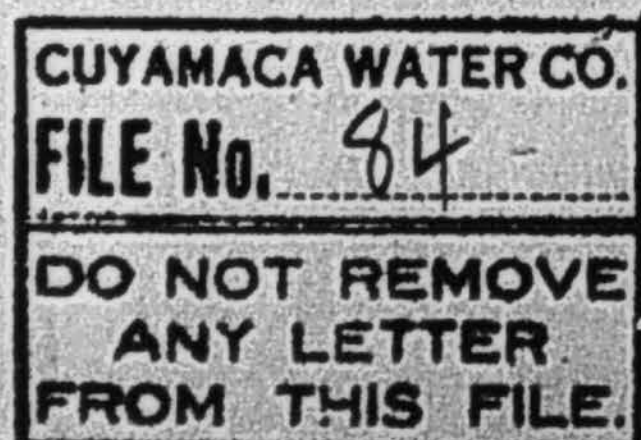

Dear Sirs: I am in receipt of a letter of June 9, inst. written by Ed Fletcher, manager of Cuyamaca Water Co., threatening to discontinue the telephone service at my ranch on the 20 inst. on failure by me to send check for \$17.80 for new telephone or for Pac. Tel. Co.

Under these circumstances I deem it sufficient to remind you that at the time the San Diego Blume, which you now own under another name, was built three sections 15 S, 2 E, these lands were unsurveyed. When subsequently surveyed and rights of way were granted thereunder, it was required that the Blume Co. should, within one year after approval of the public survey, survey

their line thru such lands, file a plot of
same with Sec. of Interior & failing in which
any settler acquiring title to these lands mean-
while must be settled with for right of way,
necessarily so far as a matter of license a mere
floating right of way would be good for un-
certainty. This state of affairs came just
before your purchase of the old flume to which
I called Mr. Nelson's attention and to the fact
that he must settle with me for the right of
way over my land to which I had obtained
patent. Having failed to comply I commenced
suit in ejectment which was pending at time
of your purchase and which was subsequently
dismissed by me, in consideration of the
furnishing by my ranch of a telephone service
by you. I have nothing whatever to do with
the Pacific Tel. Co. I know no other party in the
matter and if you should carry out the
threat to discontinue the service you would
take away the only consideration for my
action, which would result in a rescission
of our agreement and leave the matter in
status quo to wit: - without any right of way
for the flume Co over these lands.

It Is to Laugh

IT IS TO LAUGH. Twenty-seven years ago the San Diego flume was built to bring the waters from Cuyamaca lake to this city—then a busted community struggling to recover from the boom of '87.

The "flume", as it was known, was built of wood and tunnels, and was one of the most spectacular engineering feats ever attempted in the west. It cost, complete, with the Cuyamaca dam, something like \$1,250,000, and was finally stocked and bonded for \$2,200,000.

It never paid on the original investment, let alone on the watered stock, although the quality of water furnished by the flume has never been equalled by any water system in San Diego county, at least.

Finally the whole shebang, including La Mesa reservoir, was bought by Murray and Fletcher for \$150,000.

Then Col. Fletcher decided to try and sell the system to the city. The railroad commission was called in and decided that the flume might possibly have a life of two years! That was four or five years ago.

The city fathers laughed at the idea that the old flume could be good for anything, even as an auxiliary water supply. They refused to consider any proposition to purchase it.

Since that date Fletcher and his associates have collected \$110,000 for water sold to the city from this same "busted and wornout flume."

The facts are that the old Cuyamaca flume has saved our bacon during the past three months, and has been by far the most valuable asset this city has had.

Fletcher lined the old flume with rubberoid paper at a nominal cost, and experts now figure six years more life for it, and Fletcher says it is good for 20 years!

The floods came on Jan. 27-28 last. The city system, purchased from Mr. Spreckels for \$4,000,000, lost a big dam and a million dollars worth of water, more or less; the Sweetwater system lost an enormous amount of water and several hundred thousands dollars damage to the dam and system; the Escondido dam had to be drained dry to save it, and the repairs now going on will cost a very large amount of money.

Fletcher says the flood damage to the Cuyamaca system is about \$50,000, all told; all reservoirs were saved with their entire supply of water, with the result that the flume company has been able to sell the city of San Diego over \$50,000 worth of water this season alone.

Within 10 days after the flood they had a million gallons a day coming down the flume, a pumping plant was installed at Los Coches, and by March 10, a total flow of 10,000,000 gallons daily was coming to La Mesa, increased to 20,000,000 gallons by April 4.

Cuyamaca lake is full, La Mesa lake will be full within a week, and the owners have no reason to doubt that with ordinary rainfall they have a three years' supply on hand.

No wonder Col. Fletcher can buy a new Cadillac. It is to laugh!
