Dear Molly

Irwin October 14 1762.

Since the sailing of the last Fleet I have not received any Letters from England indeed there has been no Vessels arrived from thence and we have now large Packets due; in your last I had the pleasure to hear that you were much better in your Health. I hope the Hammersmith Air continues to agree with you as to my part I enjoy a perfect state of Health. I suppose you will have very great rejoicings in England for the conquest of the Hebrides I shall rejoice more if it produces a speedy & honourable peace so that I may take my departure from hence very early without any fear or apprehension of meeting with an Enemy. I was last week in Westmorland where I spent a fortnight all friends there are well, Col. Barclay & surprisingly recovered I taken a new lease of his Life, young Geo Goodin has buried his wife, she was brought to bed of a girl about 2 Months before she died. Billy Goodin's son Dick was killed a few days ago by an accident of a Gun's firing. Your Sister Kerr & family are well she is very anxious to go to England & then promises to go in the Year 1764. but he has so much business upon his hands and is making Money so fast that I question whether he

will be as good as his word. Your Brother Goodin is gone to
the Fladana I did not see ^{him} as he sat out from Kingston with-
out coming down here. In Westmoreland I saw Mr.
Cadogan and Miss Langer they were down upon a
visit with Parson Vero's family. Miss Langer was
about going to be married to Mr. Hanson but her
friends not approving of the match put a stop
to it. Mr. Bosley is with child again.
This is all the news I can inform you of.
I shall go to Town at beginning of next month
where I shall stay a fortnight & probably
have opportunities to write you from
thence. We have no vessels here that
sail from Montserrat or Lucia so that
I have no opportunity of sending you
anything. I am with all due regard
& tenders.
