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## COLLEGE AWARENESS TALKS SLATED FOR STUDENTS AND PARENTS

It is never too early to plan for a child's college education. February has been proclaimed College Awareness Month by Gov. Pete Wilson, and local universities and colleges will join together to host "College: Making It Happen," a free college preparation program designed for students in grades six through nine and their parents.

The purpose is to reaffirm the message that college preparation begins many years before the final year of high school, and that college planning is a family affair.
