

Announcement of Regents' Scholarship Winners

Nineteen San Diego County students have been listed among the 282 winners of Regents' Scholarships for study next fall on one of the campuses of the University of California, it has been announced by Dr. Clark Kerr, President of the University.

In total, the scholarships go to 178 first-semester students, to 93 continuing students (including one intercampus transfer) and to 11 transfers beginning their junior year in the University. Of the total, 64 have elected to attend the Schools of Medicine at San Francisco and Los Angeles, and the remainder are divided among the general campuses at Berkeley, Davis, Los Angeles, Riverside, San Diego, and Santa Barbara.

Top campus choice among the San Diego county winners is the new San Diego campus on Torrey Pines Mesa which was selected by five students. The Riverside campus was chosen by four San Diego County winners; Berkeley was chosen by three; Santa Barbara, Los Angeles, and the Los Angeles Medical School were each chosen by two; and one local student chose the San Francisco Medical School.

In addition, six scholarship winners from outside San Diego County have chosen to attend the new San Diego campus.

Selection of winners was on the basis of both demonstrated achievement and promise. Appointments are generally from two to four years duration.

Size of the stipends depends upon individual financial need: thus awards may be honorary in nature or may vary in an lint to include the full cost of required fees,, board and room, books and supplies and incidental expenses.

Major fields of study declared by the 282 students range through the entire spectrum of academic subject matter, from accounting to zoology, with the largest concentration in the areas of medicine, mathematics, engineering, physics, English, and chemistry.

Occupations of parents and guardians of the winners run alphabetically from accountant to writer, with teachers, engineers, salesmen, and physicians in the lead numerically.

Precedence was given to residents of California, with the result that only five other states appear on the list-two from Colorado and one each from Arizona., Florida, New York, and Oregon-- and four foreign countries-two each from Hong Kong and Israel and one each from Greece and Singapore.
