SENATOR GARY HART

"Educational Reform: Past, Present, and Future"

State Senator Gary Hart was first elected to the State Legislature in 1984. He served four terms in the State Assembly representing Santa Barbara County. He now serves the 18th Senatorial District representing portions of Los Angeles, Santa Barbara and Ventura counties.

Born in San Diego, Gary Hart attended public schools in Santa Monica, Whitter, and Santa Barbara. Senator Hart possesses a B.A. degree from Stanford University, and a Masters Degree from Harvard University. As a teacher, Senator Hart has taught in a variety of junior and senior high schools, as well as community college and university settings. As a legislator he has served continuously on the Assembly and Senate Education Committees. He is the author of a number of major education bills and has been a dedicated advocate for strengthening academic standards for better funding of public education in California. He currently serves as Chairman of the Senate Education Committee and is Vice-Chair of the joint Committee on Review of the Master Plan for Higher Education.
