 himself his heirs and Successors did give and grant unto  
 William Walker and William Full their heirs and  
 Assigns all that Parcel of Land Meadow Pasture and Wood  
 Land and whatsoever kind of Land the same is containing  
 by Estimation One Hundred and twenty Acres situate  
 lying and being at the Black River mouth in S. Eliz.  
 Parish bounding West Northerly & North Easterly on Mr  
 Dorn East Southerly on Marsh and Black River  
 and South West on the Sea together with all Edifices Woods  
 Rents Tithes Profitts Commodities wayes Passages and  
 Encumbrances whatsoever growing or being upon the  
 Premises or any part thereof and all mines and minerals  
 whatsoever in the Premises or any part of them mines of  
 Gold and Silver only Excepted To Have and to Hold  
 the said Parcel of Land with all and singular the  
 Premises unto the said William Walker and William  
 Full their heirs and Assigns for ever to be holden of his said  
 Majestic his heirs and Successors by Fealty in Free and  
 Common Socage for all Services whatsoever concerning  
 therefore Yearly unto his said Majestic his heirs and  
 Successors the Yearly Rent of one Penny for every Acre planted or

 aforesaid William Walker the Order being totally his  
 by which it was Surveyed and moreover that I was by

 he had lived till the Patent taken out and Partition made  
 I did therefore with Good and Honest Intent by  
 a conveyance made Dated the third Day of October One  
 Thousand six Hundred Seventy two Convey Ninety  
 Acres of the aforesaid Land to Edward Ray and his heirs  
 upon Condition that hee should Convey it to Patience  
 Walker the Daughter of the aforesaid William Walker  
 and her heirs when shee should come of Age or pay her  
 Sixty Pounds Stere neither of which Considerations being  
 Performed she having beene longe agoe of Age and Edward  
 Ray having beene Seis'd all yeares of the Land and not  
 heard of I do by these Presents for mee my heirs and Assigns  
 upon the Considerations aforesaid and more Especially for and  
 in Consideration of the full and just Summe of Fifty Pounds  
 Current money of this Island to me in hand paid before  
 the Insealing and Delivery of these Presents whereby I  
 Acknowledge myself fully satisfied and paid by Tho:  
 Hall the Husband of the aforesaid Patience give Grant  
 Bargaine Aliene Confirm and Sell unto Thomas Hall  
 aforesaid and Patience his wife their heirs and Assigns for  
 ever the aforesaid Ninety Acres of Land with all houses  
 Edifices Buildings and Appurtenances whatsoever Viz: One  
 half Acre by Estimation adjoining to the Black River  
 bounding Northwesterly on Morrope Easterly on Black  
 River South Westerly and North Westerly on Lieut. Coll.

Scott Capt. Sinclair and John Carris the other Parcel  
 Containing by Estimation Eighty nine Acres and one half  
 Bounding West Northwesterly and North Easterly on Coll.  
 John Vassall Southwesterly on the Sea and East Southwesterly  
 on Lieutenant Coll. Scott Lieut. Sinclair & John Carris  
 To have and to Hold the Premises to them and  
 their heirs for ever free from all Incumbrances tyttles  
 or Troubles whatsoever had made caused or Done or  
 Suffered by mee or any other Person by or under mee in  
 Testimony Whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and
