

An all-Mozart concert will be presented 8/4 in Sherwood Hall

An all-Mozart concert, the first of a series of three chamber orchestra concerts during August, will be presented at 8:30 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 4 in Sherwood Hall, 700 Prospect St., La Jolla.

Rafael Druian, noted violinist and concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic, will direct the concerts which are part of a special Summer Chamber Music Institute conducted by the University of California, San Diego.

The opening program, titled "Mozart in August," will include "Adagio and Fugue," "Serenade for Winds," "Divertimento for Strings" and "Symphony No. 34 in C Major."

The series will also feature a "Ms (s) Concert" Aug. 10 consisting of works by Felix Mendelssohn, Igor Stravinsky and Franz Schubert. The final concert on Aug. 16, called "Summer of '73," will include works by Giovanni Battista Pergolesi, Franz Joseph Haydn, Mozart, Charles Ives and Ernest Bloch.

Tickets are \$3.50 per concert or \$9 for the series and may be purchased through the UCSD Department of Music or at The Turntable in La Jolla. Patron tickets are also available at \$25 for two series tickets.

The concerts are sponsored by the UCSD Department of Music, the Friends of Chamber Music and UCSD's Summer Session.

The 33-member chamber orchestra is made up of students enrolled in the Summer Session Chamber Music Institute, a four-week course in chamber music performance. Participants were selected on the basis of tape recordings of their performance and personal auditions.

This is the second year Druian has directed UCSD's Summer Chamber Music Institute. He also served as a Visiting Senior Lecturer and director of the Chamber Orchestra and Chamber Ensemble at UCSD during 1970 and 1971.
