EVENT: "Women in Computer Science" -- A Panel Discussion

BACKGROUND: Mounting evidence suggests that women are either not choosing, or dropping out of, the education pipeline leading to academic or industrial careers in computer science. This problem may be prolonged since studies show that girls from grade school to high school are losing interest in computing.

A panel of women who has achieved distinction in computer science has been assembled to discuss why women are turning away from this relatively young field, and what academia and industry can do to reverse the trend.

The panel discussion has been organized by Computer Professionals for Social Responsibility, a national nonprofit, public interest organization of computer professionals dedicated to promoting the responsible use of computer technology.
