My first water bill was sent to me some time
in the first part of April, for Jan, Feb, and March.
not being able to get out myself, I sent the bill
over to the office by my husband and paid
it, and in May, Mr. Morrison's water bill and my
water bill for April and May was sent to
Martin Knoutson for collection, and I went
to Mr. Knoutson's store and paid the \$2.50
for April and May, and took his receipt for
the same. and he went to the Bank and paid
in as a whole, his own bill and Mr. Morrison's
and mine. He did not separate the bills, and
there is where the trouble come in but he has it
credited on his Bank book. If you will write to
Mr. Knoutson, he will testify to what I have
wrote you. ^{Mr.} Matthews did not turn the water
off, but threatened to turn it off, but said he
