San Diego June 24, 1837

Mr. C. W. Morse

Dear Sir, according to promise  
I send by this boat, directed to Mr. A. J. Chase  
the balance of leather on hand.

39 skins of skirting leather  
3 Hids of black upper leather  
6 packets of deer, clasps of upper leather  
24 black goatskins  
32 doz tanned deer skins

I hope you will succeed in getting clear of all,  
for a reasonable price before you leave San  
Francisco. Rodrigues who was here in San  
Diego told me it was very high above, but this  
is all told, the question is who pays this  
high price? Yours of the 19 I have just  
now received, and noticed that the price of  
Copper has increased some, but that the  
price of silver is doubled yet. This concerns  
me but very little for the information I have  
received in your absence is satisfactory to me  
and will be so to you, after I have communicated  
every thing I am informed of to you. As far as  
concerns entering into business with Mr. Ray  
this is up to this moment impossible, for  
it appears to me, as if he wants to take the

utmost advantage of our poverty, but as far  
as I am concerned he will not succeed. Mr Ray  
runs after me and Sam Samuel every day to enter  
into agreements with us, but we always have  
excuses on hand. the last excuses I told him, that  
I could not enter in any arrangement with him  
before I had seen you again, for I had given  
you power to transact business concerning  
my mines etc for me in San Francisco. My  
opinion is now ~~not~~ to enter into any arrangement at all  
with him, for two reasons, first to judge by his expressions  
he wants all advantages, and second I had just now  
a conversation, with Mr. Norlin he is going up  
by this boat, and will have a conversation with  
you like wise, by side he thinks he is able, and  
willing to assist you in other matters, for instance  
in the sale of leather ~~and~~ by side we know him.  
So far as money raising concerns I mean by side  
the leather. I would advise you, if you can  
not do it to great advantage not to do it at all  
for I believe we can freight our way through without  
it, but if it can be done with Mr Norlin's  
assistance than it will be all right. Now  
closing I repeat again not to enter any contracts  
concerning the mines except selling Ores. For when  
you come back again, I have to tell you some  
thing of importance and ~~staying~~ saying that I have  
good news from the mine I remain respectfully,
